

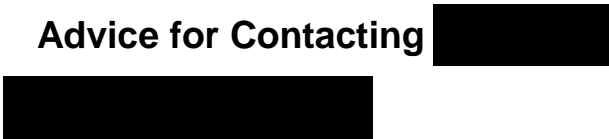

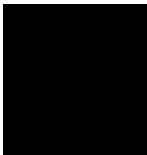

Frequently testified at City Council Meetings regarding ordinance issues and legislative provisions including petitioning for, and obtaining approval of and funding of the 6 acre Williams neighborhood Park. My education includes a J.D. degree and admission as an attorney, in Colorado, since October 1969. Am currently licensed, but inactive, in the Colorado Bar. After 34 years of legal practice was asked to apply for and was nominated as a Federal Judge of the U.S. Tax Court and was unanimously confirmed by the U.S. Senate on or about April 7, 2003. I retired from the Court on January 1, 2018 and have lived in Long Beach since January 1, 2017. During that time I have become reasonably knowledgeable of the City as my son has lived in Long Beach since 2010 and my daughter has also lived in the City but now lives in Lakewood.

As a private citizen, a member of the US Armed Forces, and later as a US Tax Court Judge I have always dedicated myself to serving my fellow citizens, my community, and our country.

As a private citizen I have donated my time to local government by serving on the Board of Adjustments & Appeals for the City of Greenwood Village, CO. Served as the president of my local homeowners association for 10 years during which time I was able help organize the community to establish two large public parks, Wallace Park and Francis H. Williams Park, which continue to be a resource for the residents of Greenwood Village and Denver.

As a tax attorney I have served as a fellow and regent of the American College of Tax Counsel and a former chairman of the Taxation Section of the Colorado Bar Association. I have also served as chairman of the Small-Business Tax Committee of the Colorado Association of Commerce and Industry and as president of the Greater Denver Tax Counsel Association. I am a past chairman of the Administrative Practice Committee of the American Bar Association Tax Section, a member of the Council, and a member of the Advisory Committee of the American Bar Association Section of Dispute Resolution.
