Primary Election Stats



Busiest Vote Centers in Long Beach

- El Dorado Park West-Teen Center (2,168 voters)
- Bay Shore Community Congregational Church- Gymnasium (1,824 voters)
- Pan American Park- Gymnasium (1,614 voters)

65% of Long Beach voters Voted by Mail

22% of in-person voters voted during the 10-day early voting period



Priorities



Safety and security of voters and election workers

Maximize Vote by Mail options and participation

Align capacity to highest expected volume and to predictive analytics

Market voting events to encourage early voting

Target mobile and flex voting programs to address geographically isolated areas and voters who have historically faced barriers to access

Effectively and broadly communicate information on voting options and encourage voters to plan ahead for when, where and how they will vote

Safe Presidential Election Plan




VOTER INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE RELATING TO COVID-19

All registered voters will be mailed a Vote by Mail ballot. L.A. County will encourage voters to stay at home and vote using their mail-in ballot. Although we will offer in-person voting, we will strictly follow the State and County's public health and safety guidelines to ensure we provide a safe voting environment.

COVID-19 Information for Voting In-Person:

- 1. Voters should wear a clean face-covering when visiting the Vote Center
- 2. Masks and gloves will be available to voters if requested
- 3. Hand sanitizer will be available upon entry and exit and at other key stations
- 4. Election Workers will be wearing protective gloves and masks
- 5. Social distancing will be enforced throughout the full voting process
- 6. ePollbooks and Ballot Marking Devices will be sanitized after every voter
- 7. Curbside voting available for voters who are unable to enter vote center

- First day Vote by Mail Drop Boxes open
- First day of early voting at RR/CC Headquarters

• October 24

Vote Centers open: 10 AM to 7 PM

September 24

Mailing of Sample Ballot Books

October 19

Official Registration Deadline

Important: if a voter is not registered by this date they will not be issued a Vote by Mail ballot **★** November 3

Election Day 7 AM to 8 PM
