

Sport fields and courts are park amenities that offer a multitude of physical and mental health benefits. They are used by individuals, schools, youth, adults, and seniors.

To keep these valuable amenities playable and modern, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine has a history of partnering with the community to provide periodic and seasonal improvements to sports fields and courts.





Type of Improvements

- Replenish brick dust, field dirt, etc.,
- Replenish fencing (backstops, dugouts,
- perimeter, etc.)
- Replacing field or court components
- Painting (court surfaces, walls, backstops, benches, etc.)
- Improvements to storage containers/facilities and irrigation
- Snack and concessions stands

If you or your group are interested in proposing an improvement to a park sports field or court, this toolkit was created to provide a user-friendly step-by-step guide.
