


LBPRC, INC. has never caused a problem at our location to warrant any eviction.

Dear City Council Members

Please let this letter serve the intentions of the below signed (all Long Beach Voters).

It is our concern that the current vote to restrict dispensaries that are within 1500 feet of a high school to be overly restrictive. This restriction, without a doubt, limits us patients to fair and reasonable access to our just medication. We feel that this restriction is unjust and very arbitrary. While all other ordinances, at best, limit this footage rule to 1,000 feet, Long Beach City Council has voted that 1,500 ft. to be appropriate. If the City Council were to take time out and look at the buffer maps of the city, they would find that this rule restricts us patients to procure our medicine in a safe and desirable location.

Not only are we the patients restricted from desirable locations, we are affected by the basic monopoly that it develops, thus allowing the dispensaries (that are left standing) to increase the cost of our medication due to diminished competition.

It is our right as patients, who have attained a prescription (recommendation) from our Doctors, to procure our medicine equal to the rights of other patients who have considerable availability to theirs via pharmacies, etc.

It is asked via our signatures below that the Long Beach City Council reevaluate this footage rule to no more than 1,000 feet from high schools.
