HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a resolution authorizing a waiver of permit fees and other applicable fees for work in connection with recent flooding to properties in Long Beach. (Citywide)

DISCUSSION

On February 9, 2010, the City Council approved an item related to flooding from recent storms in Long Beach. Several action steps were approved, including one pertaining to waiving applicable fees, as called out in the attached resolution, for repairs to damage of properties caused by the recent storms. Under the City's current fee resolution, the City Manager is not authorized to waive permit fees; the attached resolution grants that authority.

With Council approval, all City permit fees and other applicable fees associated with work necessary to repair, correct, or replace flood or storm damaged properties located in Long Beach will be waived. This waiver will be retroactive to cover necessary permits resulting from flooding from January 19 through February 10, 2010. Additionally, staff will provide expedited building plan reviews. If State or Federal emergency assistance programs become available, staff will work with affected property owners to assist in the process.

This letter was reviewed by Assistant City Attorney Michael J. Mais on February 12, 2010 and by Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on February 11, 2010.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

Immediate Council action is requested to implement the recommendation, and allow property owners ample time to apply for necessary permits before the June 1, 2010 deadline.

FISCAL IMPACT

Based on reports received from property owners for property damage caused by the January 19 through February 10, 2010 storms, it is anticipated approximately 100 properties may require City permits for repair work. The permit value is estimated to be \$75,000, which represents approximately 1.1 percent of the permit revenue collected in the previous fiscal year (FY 2009). Approval of the waiver will impact FY 2010 revenue received by the Development Services Fund (SR137) in the Department of Development Services.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING A WAIVER OF PERMIT FEES FOR WORK TO REPAIR OR CORRECT FLOOD AND STORM RELATED DAMAGE CITYWIDE

WHEREAS, during the period of January 19, 2010 through February 10, 2010, the City of Long Beach experienced an unusual amount of rainfall during a short period of time, which rainfall event led to flooding in certain areas of the City causing storm and flood related damage to homes, condominiums and other properties located in the City of Long Beach; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach has been granted authority by the State of California to provide for the health, safety, welfare, comfort and convenience of the City and the inhabitants thereof, and for the protection of property therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. Notwithstanding the fees otherwise specified in Resolution No.

RES 10-0010 ("the Master Fee Resolution"), the City Council authorizes the City

Manager, or designee, to waive fees, including Building Permit Fees, Electrical Permit

Fees, Mechanical Permit Fees, Plumbing Permit Fees, Combined Building Permit Fees,

NPDES Fees, Plan Check Fees, Grading Fees, Demolition Fees, Utility Re-establishment

Fees and applicable Surcharge Fees, Fire Department Plan Check Fees and Permit

Fees for work applied for to repair, correct, or replace flood and storm related damage to

properties identified as flood and storm damaged properties.

Section 2. That this waiver of fees shall only apply to such flood and storm related damages and properties as determined by the City Manager or designee that are located in the City of Long Beach and which suffered damage during January 19, 2010

through February 10, 2010.

Section 3. That said fees may be waived for an applicant who is rebuilding, repairing, or replacing legally built structures which have been damaged or destroyed by flood and/or storm. The fee waiver shall not apply to any portion of a new structure which exceeds the square footage of the structure being replaced, and shall only be applied to permits applied for on or before June 1, 2010, unless said date is otherwise extended by the City Council by resolution.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
