What is the U.S. Census?

- Every 10 years, the government reports the number of people who live in the United States by conducting a count called the census
- All persons are required to be counted
- This count is required by the U.S. Constitution



Key Dates

February - March 2010: Census questionnaires are mailed or

delivered to households

April 1, 2010: Census Day – Use this day as point of

reference for returning your completed

forms

April – July 2010: Census takers visit households that did

not return a questionnaire by mail

December 2010: By law, Census Bureau delivers population

counts to the President for apportionment

March 2011: By law, Census Bureau completes delivery

of redistricting data to states



What's at Stake?


- Census data is used to determine the number of representatives your state receives in the U.S. Congress, as well as your county's representation in state legislature
- Government agencies use the data to make funding decisions for more than \$400 billion in federal and state funding for local communities

That's 4 trillion over a 10-year period!

 In Long Beach, it is estimated that each person counted represents \$2,900 in federal or state funding over a 10-year period


Challenge of the Undercount

- **<u>Privacy</u>**: Some people are reluctant to give the government personal information
- Confidentiality: Some people worry the information they provide could be used against them

Never shared with other governmental agencies!

- Immigration and Citizenship Concerns: Some people do not want to draw attention to themselves
- <u>Difficulty in Counting</u>: 46 of 116 census tracts are considered hard to count based on a number of variables


- Additional health care services







