

- Provide preparedness training to the community and City staff.







ALL HAZARD PREPAREDNESS





EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEMS



Free emergency notifications providing residents important information before, during and after a major emergency via phone, text and email.



Free app that has the ability to recognize earthquake shaking using sensors created by USGS and CalOES



Using this Federal alerting system, the City provides emergency notifications. This system works much like AMBER alerts.

EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS: 9-1-1

PUBLIC SAFETY DISPATCHERS

- Receive over 800,000 emergency calls annually. Dispatched nearly 300,000 emergency personnel and equipment.
- Both Call Centers meet State requirements for response times.
- Fire and Police dispatchers currently in cross training program.

HOMELAND SECURITY GRANTS

URBAN AREAS SECURITY INITIATIVE (UASI)

Prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism

STATE HOMELAND SECURITY PROGRAM (SHSP)
