LACRIS Facial Recognition Technology is provided strictly for law enforcement purposes with human review and additional investigation needed for each search


...user activity within the system are routinely audited to prevent misuse, and to identify possible training topics for future users


The use of Facial Recognition produces a potential investigative lead and requires investigative follow-up to corroborate the lead before any action is taken.


Facial Recognition tools offered to the Los Angeles Law Enforcement community is **not surveillance**. The system does not have the capability to record, ingest, process, scan, or save live video feeds. Facial Recognition is not identification, nor can it be the sole basis of an arrest or detention.
















