Long Beach 2022 Homeless Count

- The 2022 PIT Count will take place on the morning of Tuesday, January 25 with a staggered deployment due to COVID-19
- Requests for volunteers and marketing to go out in early November
- Updates to the Count that Staff are exploring:
 - Transition to full use of mobile app for count and surveys
 - Visual counts of vehicular homelessness
 - Incorporation of Youth survey into PIT Count
 - Virtual volunteer trainings and videos



Long Beach 2022 Homeless Count

Requests for HSAC Members:

- Volunteers for the count and logistics
 - Field Team Volunteers and Leads
 - Volunteer Check-in and Coordination
 - Parking coordination
- Donations for count incentives, such as gift cards, hygiene kit supplies, socks, etc.
- Donations for volunteers, such as food or drink
- Marketing of volunteer opportunity through networks





Outreach Update

October 2021:

- 103 recorded contacts
- 86 visits to locations throughout the City
- 75 contacts accepted services such as hygiene, emergency shelter, or case management
- 20 contacts through Tidelands and Weekend Outreach
- 70 requests for outreach



Outreach Hot Spot Locations

- LA River
- 710 between 20th and Gale
- Mac Arthur Park
- 405 at Lakewood
- San Gabriel Riverbed from Willow to PCH
- Granada Lot
- Anaheim Corridor
- 14th st Park
- Harvey Milk



Participant Engagement Outcomes

- 154 individuals accessed the MSC for the first time
- 611 individuals in active case management
- 47 individuals at Project Roomkey (on average)
- 112 individuals at Project Homekey (on average)
- 62 individuals at Winter/Cold Weather Shelter (on average)
- 69 individuals at Atlantic Bridge Housing Community (on average)
- 76 households stabilized in a motel





Bureau Updates

Staffing

- Jessica Villalobos promoted to Administrative Analyst III
- Health Educator II: Sally Hay (Starting the 8th)
- MSC Coordinator: Tyler Ahntonen (Starting the 15th)
- REACH Mental Health Clinician: Lauren Feiring (Starting the 29th)
- 8 people are within the background and screening process
- Currently in interview stage: Health Educator II Outreach and Libraries
- Currently in recruitment: Homeless Services Program Officer, Public Health Nurse, Admin Analyst II, LBRA Coordinator, Data Analyst, Clerk Typist III



Operations Update

Winter Shelter

- Winter Shelter has been extended to operate in November at its current location
- Working to finalize the move to a new location starting in December

Intensive Case Management Services

- Intensive case management service contracts recommendations will be going to City Council on November 9th
- Anticipated start date for getting some of the services is December 1st



HUD NOFO

- The Bureau is working to finalize the CoC application to HUD for next years funding, which will be submitted before November 16th
- Efforts include conducting a procurement for new funding opportunities to include in the larger competition with HUD. The following will be included for new programs.
 - 1 DV Bonus project which includes a RRH-TH project and the creation of a coordinated entry project for households fleeing DV
 - 1 Bonus Project that would expand an existing project to add an additional 25 slots of PSH
 - 1 Expansion Project of an existing Youth RRH program that would add an ability to serve 2 more youth
- The application include renewal project profiles for our existing 21 CoC project grants as well as the CoC Planning and UFA grants



Emergency Housing Vouchers

- Over 350 people have been matched to vouchers at this point
- Approximately 150 vouchers have been issued and are now on the street
- 7 lease ups as of October 29th, with multiple people who are in process



Pandemic Response Updates

- There is a continued downward trend in positivity rates for people experiencing homelessness, with only 3 newly reported cases in October
- The most recent State and Federal Health Orders require that persons working within medical settings are vaccinated or received a waiver exemption. This may have impact on staffing for some of the programs that fall into this category. Areas that would fall under this requirement are:
 - Any site that has a medical facility located within it, such as the MSC
 - Any site serving persons who have been identified as medically vulnerable, such as PRK/PHK
- The City is working with shelter providers to have the mobile clinic go to all sites to provide opportunity for the booster vaccine. This will occur later this month.
