Maria Alarcon has made a claim for injuries allegedly sustained in the course of her employment with the City of Long Beach. The Economic Development and Finance Committee on December 5, 2006, approved the submission to the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board of Stipulations with Request for Award by the City and Maria Alarcon, based upon a 21 percent disability rating, with provision for lifetime medical care as may be necessary.

Erik Burks has made a claim for injuries allegedly sustained in the course of his employment with the City of Long Beach. The Economic Development and Finance Committee on November 21, 2006, approved the submission to the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board of Stipulations with Request for Award by the City and Erik Burks, based upon a 6 % percent disability rating, with provision for lifetime medical care as may be necessary.

Brian Grogan has made a claim for injuries allegedly sustained in the course of his employment with the City of Long Beach. The Economic Development and Finance Committee on November 21, 2006, approved the submission to the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board of Stipulations with Request for Award by the City and Brian Grogan, based upon 1) a 78 percent disability rating with a further provision for a life pension at the rate of \$69.58 per week to be paid after the permanent

disability has been paid in full. This would include a provision for lifetime medical care as may be necessary; and 2) a \$10,000.00 buyout of vocational rehabilitation benefits.

Hugh Thomas McNicholl has made a claim for injuries allegedly sustained in the course of his employment with the City of Long Beach. The Economic Development and Finance Committee on November 21, 2006, approved the submission to the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board of two Stipulations with Request for Award by the City and Hugh Thomas Mc Nicholl based upon 1) a 25 percent permanent disability rating, with provision for lifetime medical care as may be necessary, and 2) an 18 percent permanent disability rating, with provision for lifetime medical care as may be necessary.

Richard Montoya has made a claim for injuries allegedly sustained in the course of his employment with the City of Long Beach. The Economic Development and Finance Committee on November 21, 2006, approved the submission to the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board of two Stipulations with Request for Award by the City and Richard Montoya, based upon 1) a 6 percent disability rating, with provision for lifetime medical care as may be necessary, and 2) a 13 percent disability rating, with provision for lifetime medical care as may be necessary

Rudy Romero has made a claim for injuries allegedly sustained in the course of his employment with the City of Long Beach. The Economic Development and Finance Committee on December 5, 2006, approved the submission to the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board of Stipulations with Request for Award by the City and Rudy Romero, based upon a 16 percent disability rating, with provision for lifetime medical care as may be necessary.
