Recommendation to adopt resolution authorizing City Manager, or designee, to execute all documents necessary to enter into an agreement, and any subsequent amendments, with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, to provide jail food services, in an annual amount not to exceed \$350,000, for a period of two years, with the option to renew for three additional one-year periods. (District 2)

City Council approval is requested to enter into a contract with the County of Los Angeles through the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD), for jail food services to individuals booked at the City of Long Beach's (City) jail facility. The scope of services in the agreement includes providing and delivering pre-packaged meals in accordance with the nutritional, caloric, food preparation, and quality requirements mandated by the State of California.

The Long Beach Police Department (LBPD) recommends establishing a new agreement with LASD for jail food services based on the following factors: common practices and procedures amongst law enforcement agencies, proximity and availability to the food services at the Los Angeles County Courthouse, unique variety in menu selections, and extensive experience in providing food services to inmates.

LBPD evaluated procurement options and learned that the City of Glendale recently awarded a contract to LASD after performing a review of the cost per meal rate for competitors. LASD has the lowest cost per meal rate and provides a consistent level of service that satisfies all established guidelines outlined by the Board of State and Community Corrections. Additionally, LASD has proven to be effective in providing jail food services to the City for several years. After a thorough review, it was determined that LASD meets and/or exceeds

the City's requirements.

City Charter Section 1802 provides an alternative procurement method by permitting the City to purchase or otherwise obtain services, supplies, materials, equipment, and labor with other governmental agencies by purchasing under their contracts on a voluntary and selective basis when authorized by a Resolution of the City Council.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Monica J. Kilaita on August 29, 2018 and by Budget Management Officer Rhutu Amin Gharib on September 13, 2018.

City Council action is requested on October 9, 2018, to ensure the continuity of food services at the City jail facility.

The annual contract amount not to exceed \$350,000, is budgeted in the General Fund (GF) in the Police Department (PD). There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.
