



## Legislation Text

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Recommendation to authorize City Manager to execute all necessary documents to receive and expend proceeds from the U.S. Small Business Administration in the amount of \$50,000, for the express purpose of participation in the Start-Up in a Day Prize Competition, of which Long Beach is an award winner; and

Increase appropriations in the General Grants Fund (SR 120) in the City Manager Department (CM) by \$50,000. (Citywide)

In August 2015, the City of Long Beach was selected by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) as a "Start Small" Start-up in a Day (Competition), \$50,000 prize winner. The SBA announced the 2015 Competition, pursuant to the America Competes Act, to spur the development, implementation, and improvement of online tools that will let entrepreneurs learn about the business start-up process in their area, including how to register and apply for all required local licenses and permits, all in one day or less.

The City's Innovation Team (i-team), in the Office of the City Manager, will work with City departments to carry out the scope of the agreements with the SBA and its partners. This includes outreach to small business owners and business associations, research of best practices, and design sessions to build online tools that accelerate the business start-up and growth process. On August 11, 2015, the City Council approved the engagement of Code for America to assist with the construction of online tools for businesses. SBA prize funds may be used to assist with this project.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Amy Webber on September 10, 2015 and by Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on September 15, 2015.

City Council action is requested on October 6, 2015 to allow for the receipt and expense of SBA funds. SBA requires all documents to be executed before prize funds are disbursed to award cities.

The City will receive \$50,000 from SBA to offset costs for the Start-up in a Day Project (Project). An appropriation increase in the General Grants Fund (SR 120) in the City Manager Department (CM) is requested. The City's total cost for completion of the Project is \$220,000 and is budgeted in the General Grants Fund (SR 120) in the City Manager Department (CM). This amount will be drawn from the City's \$1 million cash match requirement (Innovation Fund) for the Bloomberg Innovation Team grant approved by the City Council on February 3, 2015. SBA prize funds will reimburse some of the costs associated with this Project. There are no restrictions on the use of SBA prize funds and no City match requirement to receive

prize funds. Approval of this recommendation will provide continued support to the local economy.
