Recommendation to adopt Plans and Specifications No. R-6709 for the improvement of Walnut Avenue between 10th Street and Pacific Coast Highway; and authorize the City Manager to execute a contract with Silvia Construction, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder, in an estimated amount of \$1,103,479 plus a 15 percent contingency amount, if necessary. (Districts 2,6)

The infrastructure on Walnut Avenue between 10th Street and Pacific Coast Highway is in need of rehabilitation. The rehabilitation work consists of replacing damaged curbs and gutters, driveways, alley entrances and sidewalks; trimming and root pruning trees; reconstructing areas of deteriorated pavement; cold milling and resurfacing the pavement; and installing pavement markers, markings, traffic striping, signing and curb paint.

City Council adoption of the plans and specifications and award of the contract to the lowest responsible bidder are being recommended concurrently to expedite implementation of this project. The project was advertised for bid on February 9, 2007, and the bids were opened on March 7, 2007. Information regarding Silvia Construction, Inc., is provided on the attached contract awards document.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Lori A. Conway on March 15,2007, and by Budget and Performance Management Bureau Manager David Wodynski on March 16, 2007. In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act, Categorical Exemption No. CEP-696-03 has been issued for this project.

City Council action on this matter is requested on April 3, 2007, to authorize commencement of this Public Works project. Construction is anticipated to begin in July 2007 and should take approximately 45 working days.

The contract award is for an estimated amount of \$1,103,479 plus a 15 percent contingency amount of \$165,522, if necessary. Sufficient funds to cover the contract are budgeted in the Special Revenue Fund (SR) in the Department of Public Works (PW). The funding sources are Gasoline Tax and the Transportation Equity Act for the Twenty-First Century (TEA-21) monies.
