Recommendation to authorize City Manager, or designee, to approve a fee waiver for the use of dock space for visiting vessels in Alamitos Bay Marina for the Long Beach Yacht Club's Congressional Cup, in an amount not to exceed \$3,700, during the period of April 16, 2018 through April 22, 2018. (District 3)

The Congressional Cup is a five-day event, hosted by the Long Beach Yacht Club (LBYC). It is a world-class annual match race sailing regatta for keelboats. During this week, more than 100 races will be held with ten of the world's top match racing skippers and crew participating. This year's event is expected to draw participants, coaches, family, and friends.

LBYC has requested that docking fees for visiting vessels, in an amount not to exceed \$3,700, be waived for participants and support vessels docking at the Alamitos Bay Marina Long Dock adjacent to LBYC. This sailing event attracts state, regional, and world-wide media attention for the City of Long Beach, along with additional revenue to local businesses such as hotels, restaurants, grocery, and boating supply stores, as well as other retail establishments. These benefits outweigh the revenue loss resulting from the waived dock fees. This event is consistent with the Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine's partnering policy to support organizations that provide a service to the community and its residents by promoting the Long Beach marinas.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Linda T. Vu on February 13, 2018 and by Budget Management Officer Rhutu Amin Gharib on February 22, 2018.

City Council action is requested on March 13, 2018, to reserve the required dock space in Alamitos Bay Marina prior to the start of the event.

The value of the fee waiver shall not exceed \$3,700. Since no additional revenue specifically related to dock fees for visiting vessels during the Congressional Cup was budgeted, there is no fiscal impact associated with the proposed fee waiver. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.
