Recommendation to authorize City Manager to execute an agreement, and any subsequent amendments, with the California Department of Education in the amount of \$1,783.32 for the provision of health and sanitation inspections for the Summer Food Service Program for a period of three months. (Citywide)

For over 15 years, the California Department of Education has provided federal funds for the City of Long Beach Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to provide health and sanitation inspections of the food service operations for the Summer Food Service Program within its jurisdiction. This program is provided in 33 sites throughout the City, including schools and Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine sites.

Inspections are made in accordance with State and local environmental health standards and may include: visiting feeding sites and performing temperature testing of the food as it is prepared, delivered or served; observing for safe and sanitary food handling techniques; and checking for proper storage and handling of food. Under this agreement, DHHS will receive \$1,783.32 for these inspections to be conducted during the summer of 2005.

This matter was reviewed by Senior Deputy City Attorney Donna F. Gwin on June 6, 2005 and by Budget Management Officer David Wodynski on June 8, 2005.

Services under the agreement will commence on July 1, 2005. Therefore, City Council action is requested on June 21, 2005.

The City will receive grant revenues of \$1,783.32 to offset expenditures of the same amount. Sufficient funds are budgeted in the Department of Health and Human Services (HE) and in the Health Fund (SR 130).
