Recommendation to authorize City Attorney to pay the sum of \$20,000 in full settlement of lawsuit entitled McDaniel Coley v. City of Long Beach, et al. This lawsuit arises out of a Long Beach Police Officer, in the course and scope of his employment, running a red light and striking plaintiff's vehicle. The force of the impact resulted in the total loss of plaintiffs Honda Pilot SUV.

Plaintiff's original demand was \$184,000.00. Through mediation the parties were able to reach a tentative settlement agreement of \$20,000.00, subject to City Council approval.

The Economic Development and Finance Committee approved the proposed settlement on February 1, 2010.

This lawsuit arises out of a Long Beach Police Officer running a red light and striking a vehicle driven by an insured of USAA Casualty Insurance Company. The plaintiff was seeking reimbursement for property damage and medical payments in the amount of \$19,239.78.

During mediation the parties were able to reach a tentative settlement agreement of \$12,000.00, subject to City Council approval.

The Economic Development and Finance Committee approved the proposed settlement on February 1, 2010.
