Subject:

Adopt Specifications WD-17-21 and authorize the General Manager to execute an agreement with Bradley Tanks Inc. to provide excavation material hauling and disposal services in an amount not to exceed \$815,000 for a period of one year, and the option to renew for two additional one-year periods in an amount not to exceed a 5% increase for each renewal period.

Executive Summary:

As part of routine construction activity, the Water and Sewer Operations will generate construction waste (e.g., soil, rebar, and concrete) that will need to be disposed of at a landfill. In the past, in-house staff would transport and dispose construction material at a transfer station located in the City of Wilmington using LBWD's 10 wheel dump trucks. However, due to recent changes in disposal requirements at this transfer station, an alternate disposal site for construction materials was needed. Research into possible disposal sites showed the nearest landfill was in the City of Azusa. Due to the increase in labor cost for transport and wear and tear on LBWD's 10 wheel dump trucks, a more economical approach was to solicit bids for hauling and disposal services.

Request for Bids for excavation material hauling and disposal services (Specification WD-17-21) was advertised on Planet Bids starting on April 2nd, 2021 for a period three weeks. All bids were due on April 22, 2021 and Bradley Tanks Inc. was the only bidder. After reviewing their bid, it was determined that the bid submitted conforms to all bid requirements, thus, staff recommends awarding to Bradley Tanks Inc.

Staff Recommendation:

Adopt Specifications WVD-17-21 and authorize the General Manager to execute an agreement with Bradley Tanks Inc. to provide excavation material hauling and disposal services in an amount not to exceed \$815,000 for a period of one year, and the options to renew for two additional one-year periods in an amount not to exceed a 5% increase for each renewal period.

Fiscal Impact: The cost to the Water Fund will be incurred during FY 21 and FY 22 with the actual annual amounts unknown but the maximum amount incurred will not exceed contract total of \$815,000. These costs are included in both the Sewer and Water Fund FY 21 Budget and will be included in the FY 22 Budget.
