RESOLUTION NO. RES-15-0047

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH RECOGNIZING APRIL AS CAMBODIAN GENOCIDE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, the Cambodian genocide was carried out by the Khmer Rouge regime led by Pol Pot between 1975 and 1979, resulting in the death of as many as three million people, as well as the forced relocation, forced labor, starvation and torture of as much as 25 percent (25%) of the total population of Cambodia; and

WHEREAS, following this tragedy, Long Beach became home to a significant number of Cambodian individuals and families, establishing the largest Cambodian community outside of Southeast Asia, including the first "Cambodia Town" designation in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Cambodians in Long Beach have promoted the revitalization of neighborhoods by establishing local and international businesses, arts and community organizations, have participated in the democratic process on the local and national level, and have used their cultural history and traditions to rebuild lives and heal, in the process inspiring hope; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach recognizes the numerous contributions of Cambodians to the social and economic revitalization of Long Beach and desires to recognize April as Cambodian Genocide Awareness Month in honor of the loss and hardship suffered during the Cambodian genocide, and the courage and resilience of its survivors;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. The City Council proclaims April as Cambodian Genocide

Awareness month in the City of Long Beach and urges all citizens to become familiar with
