## Grand Re-Opening of K-9 Corner Dog Park Held

The public celebrated the grand re-opening of the K-9 Corner Dog Park on December 18. The newly rehabilitated park uses drought tolerant-landscaping and generates 100% of its electricity on site with solar energy and features water fountains for people and dogs, seating, and separate areas for large and small dogs. It is one of ten dog parks located throughout the City. Approximately \$27,000 was contributed from Council District 1 one-time dedicated funds for the rehabilitation.

Additional play space for dogs was created by removing a boardwalk path and planter. Additional lighting to improve visibility in and around the park and drought tolerant landscaping were incorporated into the project to enhance the openness of the space. To complete the upgrades, staff installed a new decorative metal mesh fence.



The park originally opened in September 2009 as the result of a partnership between residents in the north Pine Avenue area of Long Beach, the Metropolitan Transit Authority and former Long Beach Redevelopment Agency.

## Stephen P. Scott Named Interim Director of Parks, Recreation and Marine




Stephen Scott has been named as the Interim Director of Parks, Recreation and Marine (PRM). The City will conduct a national recruitment for the next Director of Parks, Recreation and Marine.

Mr. Scott is currently the Deputy Director for PRM, and has previously served the City as the Interim Director. Prior to his move to PRM he was the Customer Services Manager in the

Department of Technology and Innovation; Assistant to the City Manager; and Administrative Analyst in the City's Budget Office. Mr. Scott holds a Master's Degree in Public Management from the University of Wisconsin, Madison's LaFollette School of Public Affairs, and a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He is a Long Beach resident.

On Dec. 5, 2019, the City announced that Gerardo Mouet, current Director of PRM, was retiring. His last day with the City of Long Beach was Jan. 31, 2020.

## Congratulations to 2019 Animal Care Services Explorer Class Graduates

Long Beach Animal Care Services Explorers program provides career training for qualified youth ages 14-19 who wish to learn about careers related to the humane treatment of animals.

The year-long program consists of monthly meetings, trainings, field trips and volunteer service that focus on animal handling, veterinary care, herd health care, rabies control, law enforcement, wildlife management, and special investigations. The explorers accumulated 1,002 volunteer hours which included kennel cleaning, adoption events, outreach events, PR events, and enrichment for animals.

## Animal Care Services Ends Decade With Increasingly Positive Results for Animals



Long Beach Animal Care Services Bureau (ACS) continues to see positive results with its Compassion Saves approach, which it instituted in 2019. The bureau's efforts have resulted in a sharp decrease in euthanasia, a spike in adoptions and an 88% save rate for cats and dogs combined. That save rate is the highest it has been in the last decade.

ACS continues to accomplish positive results for shelter animals:

Live release for cats and dogs combined went from 79% in 2018 to 88% in 2019, well over double the percentage from 2010.

Despite an increase in kitten intakes across the country, Long Beach continues to accomplish low combined dog and cat admissions, with thousands less annually than at the start of last decade.

Total euthanasia was reduced by 33% in 2019 from the year prior; nearly 5,000 less dogs and cats are being euthanized annually than in 2010.

Adoption numbers for the ACS-operated shelter spiked with a 45% increase, with 995 in 2019 compared to 686 in 2018.

The Compassion Saves operating model makes a strong commitment to foster care, behavior and training programs, and supports spay and neuter, and adoption programs. The model seeks to support a non-profit organization to raise private funds for LBACS, maintain LBACS as open admissions facility to accommodate all unwanted and homeless pets, and strengthen collaborations with the community, rescue partners, and volunteers with the intent to save every healthy and treatable animal.

ACS has expanded opportunities for experienced volunteers to include work with animals that need specialized training or behavior modification. ACS is now better equipped to match animals who need more specialized care with programs and resources to fit their needs.

## PRM “Agents of Discovery” Phone App Recognition

Parks, Recreation and Marine’s (PRM) “Agents of Discovery” (AOD) Smart Phone App was named an “Award of Excellence” winner in the category of “Best Marketing Campaign” in the annual California Park & Recreation Society’s (CPRS) Awards program.

PRM employs the AOD smart phone app with “Missions” at DeForest Wetlands and Willow Springs to both publicize the parks and guide visitors to locations within the parks. AOD is a free augmented reality mobile game where players (“Agents”) unlock hidden geo-located challenges that can only be solved through exploration and discovery.

The Missions make visiting these parks safe, informative, and fun. AOD is kid, teen and adult-friendly, with no in-app purchases and strict privacy safeguards. AOD is a staff multiplier, allowing PRM to have a presence at these sites, without having staff actually there. Since the app’s launch in 2018, more than 500 users have been identified.



## Long Beach Strategic Plan Encourages Community to Share Park Stories






# El Dorado Regional Park Passes-A Year Round Value

# Know You Long Beach Parks: Marina Green

The 9.39-acre Marina Green Park located at 386 E. Shoreline Drive spans from Linden Avenue to Shoreline Village Drive. The park was built as part of the construction of the Long Beach Shoreline Marina in 1982.

Most days visitors can be seen enjoying passive recreation activities such as walking, picnicking, bird watching, fishing and enjoying views of Alamitos Beach and the Shoreline Marina. On most weekends the park is transformed into a special event venue that can accommodate up to 10,000 people. The three-acre parcel from the beach to Linden Ave can accommodate 1,000 – 2,000 and the six-acre parcel from Linden Ave to Shoreline Village Dr. can accommodate 8,000 – 10,000 depending on set up.

Charity walks and runs, pro beach volleyball events, car shows, music festivals and the annual Long Beach Pride Festival and Acura Grand Prix of Long Beach are just some of the regular activities that occur each year at Marina Green Park.
