Whereas, Interval House is celebrating its Twenty-Fifth Anniversary of award-winning and lifesaving services to victims of domestic violence; and

Whereas, Interval House crisis shelters and centers for victims of domestic violence has brought honor to the City of Long Beach and has operated its headquarters, outreach center, and shelters since 1979, and has today become the most highly recognized and innovative domestic violence program in the country; and

Whereas, Interval House is the only comprehensive domestic violence program in the nation providing all services in 40 different languages, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week; and

Whereas, Interval House is the only domestic violence agency that has ever received a United States Presidential Award and it has won three Presidential Awards conferred by Presidents Clinton and Bush citing Interval House as a model domestic violence program to the nation; and

Whereas, Interval House is the only domestic violence agency that has ever received a California Governor's Award, and it has won two Governor's Awards acknowledging Interval House for the most outstanding programs serving victims in the State of California and in the nation; and

Whereas, Interval House has also received over 400 local, regional, and national awards for their cutting edge programs; and

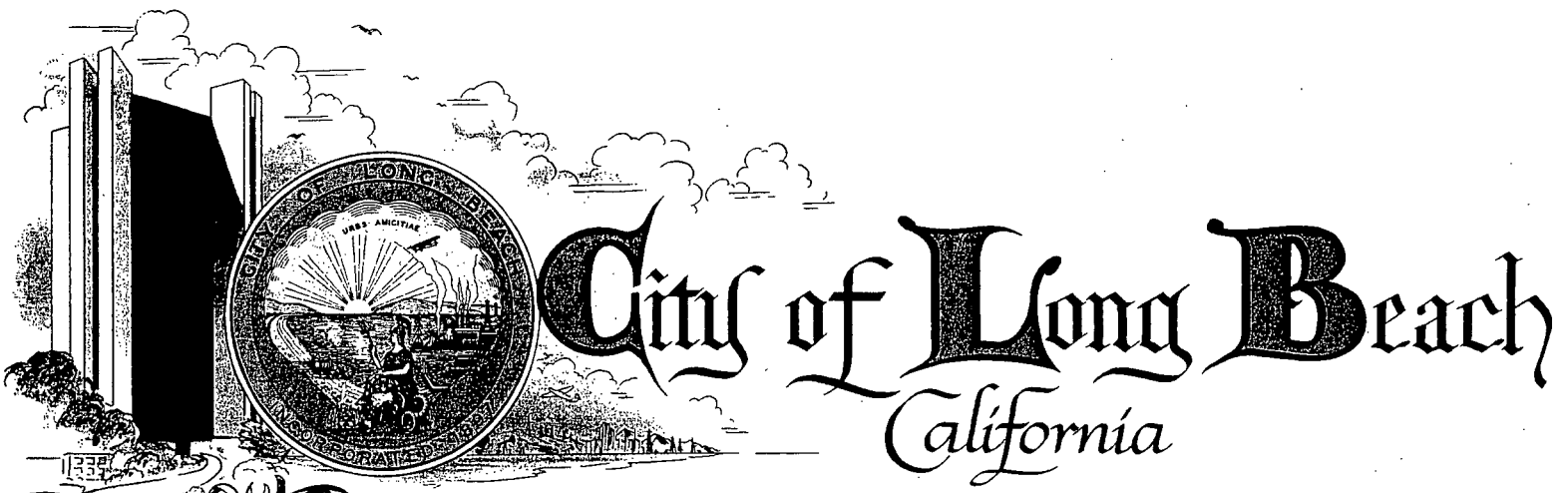

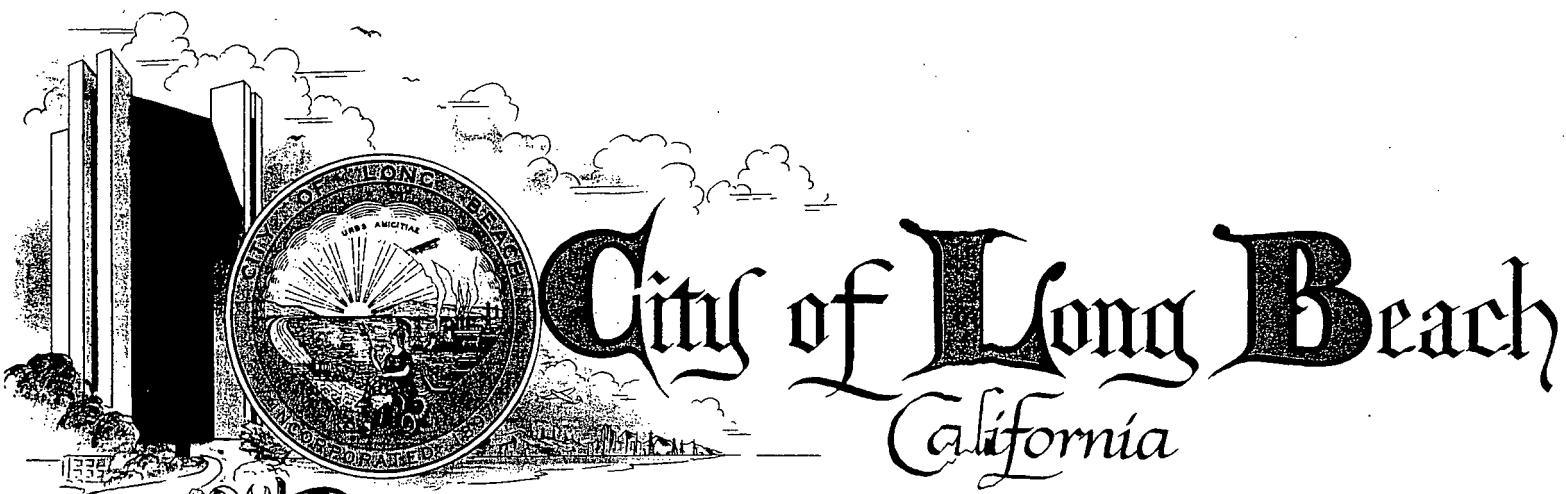

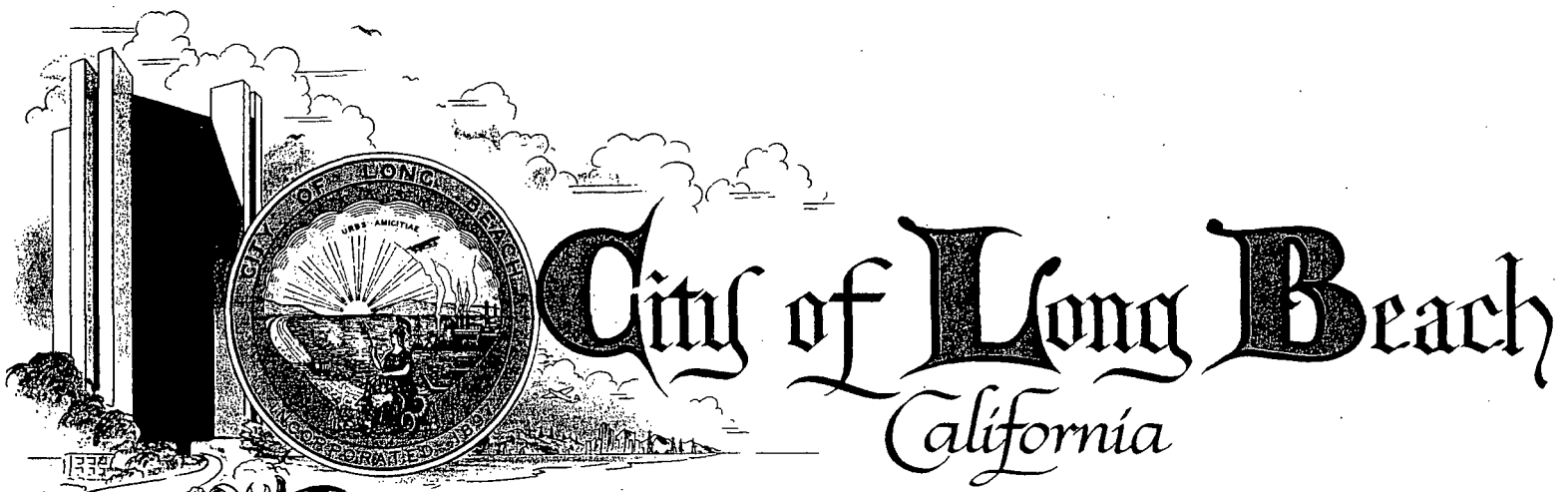
