FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT NO. 33523

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT NO. 33523 is made and entered, in duplicate, as of June 28, 2016, for reference purposes only, pursuant to a minute order adopted by the City Council of the City of Long Beach at its meeting on July 1, 2014, by and between the CITY OF LONG BEACH, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "CITY"), and LONG BEACH PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION COMPANY (hereinafter "TRANSIT"), a California nonprofit corporation, whose business is located at 1963 E. Anaheim Street, Long Beach, California 90813.

WHEREAS, TRANSIT desires to contract with the Long Beach Police Department ("LBPD") for law enforcement services in response to, the investigation of, and solving of crime problems; and

WHEREAS, CITY is willing to assist TRANSIT in responding to, investigation of, and solving of said crime problems and promoting the perceptions of safety within the community; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered Agreement No. 33523 whereby CITY agreed to provide these services; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to exercise their first option to extend the term of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to add the annual amount not to exceed \$1,849,297 for the term October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to attach a list of direct costs for the term October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, covenants, and conditions herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

1. TRANSIT shall pay CITY for security services the respective prices therefore set forth on Exhibit "A-1", attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The total expenditures for the first extension term of Agreement No. 33523

shall not exceed \$1,849,297.

2. Section 1 of Agreement No. 33523 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Unless otherwise terminated sooner in accordance with "Section 1. the provisions herein, this Agreement shall commence on October 1, 2015 and shall terminate at midnight on September 30, 2016. Subject to City Manager approval, Transit shall have the option to renew the Agreement for one (1) additional term of one (1) year."

3. Section 5 Of Agreement No. 33523 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 5. The parties shall determine the level of services to be provided. At a minimum, CITY shall provide one (1) police officer per shift, with the morning shift beginning at the start of revenue service and the afternoon shift through the conclusion of TRANSIT'S service day (approximately 0600 through 0100). Vacancies, as a result of time off, may or may not be filled at the discretion of TRANSIT. The LBPD Transit Dedicated Unit will exclusively protect TRANSIT as provided in Section 3 and 4 except where: 1) a criminal offense has been committed in an officer's presence; 2) there is a citizen or officer in distress and/or 3) there is an emergency requiring deployment of all available sworn officers. This is limited to declared emergencies by the Mayor, City Manager or Chief of Police. All shifts as provided in Section 2 that are not utilized will be adjusted within the restrictions of the budget as provided in Section 9.

The LBPD shall provide the following services to support and improve TRANSIT operations:

- Provide safety and security for TRANSIT employees, customers and assets.
 - Continually monitor the TRANSIT and the LBPD radio and respond to TRANSIT calls for service in and out of the City.
 - Provide patrol of TRANSIT routes, bus stops, the Transit Gallery and

other TRANSIT facilities and assets.

- Focus enforcement efforts on the improvement of TRANSIT operations.
- Communicate with TRANSIT management and respond to TRANSIT's law enforcement needs.
- Identify suspicious activity, contact suspicious persons continually seek to identify threats to homeland security and TRANSIT operations.
- Use problem-solving and crime prevention models to address concerns.
- Provide professional customer service and positively engage TRANSIT employees and customers.
- Address quality-of-life and environmental concerns and intervene in activities or conditions that are detrimental to TRANSIT operations and service.
- Conduct uniform and plainclothes operations at the direction of the Transit Detail Sergeant.
- Conduct criminal investigations and interviews, file traffic reports involving TRANSIT vehicles and assets, collect and process evidence, complete TRANSIT reports, enforce the law, issue citations and make arrests as necessary.
- When necessary, use lawful and appropriate force to protect life and property and safely effect arrests.
- Conduct plainclothes surveillance operations at the Transit Mall four times per year.
- Conduct training opportunities for TRANSIT Supervisors twice per year.
- Participate in at least one multi-agency preparedness exercise per

year.

- Provide a monthly report, completed by each officer, to TRANSIT management identifying the following:
 - o Officer's name, DID and service dates
 - o Crimes investigated
 - Calls for service/field investigations
 - Traffic citations
 - Parking citations
 - Misdemeanor citations
 - o District car checks
 - o Reports
 - o Bus boardings
 - Misdemeanor and felony arrests
 - Vehicle numbers and mileage
 - Non TRANSIT related overtime
 - Provide an annual report of significant accomplishments to TRANSIT."
- 4. Section 8 Of Agreement No. 33523 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 8. TRANSIT shall provide the LBPD Transit Dedicated Unit with eight (8) portable radios consistent with TRANSIT issued equipment. TRANSIT shall provide LBPD with work space, and such other tools, equipment, and services as necessary to perform the duties agreed to including, but not limited to, training, data, reports, requests, transit material, and information."

5. Except as expressly modified herein, all of the terms and conditions contained in Agreement No. 33523 are ratified and confirmed and shall remain in full force and effect.
