

- Two Grants Funded
  - Lead Based Paint Hazard Control Program » \$2,999,947
  - Healthy Homes Demonstration Grant» \$874,992




- Grant History
  - July 2008- DHHS submits application to HUD for Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes Grants
  - September 2008-Grants scored high, however not funded due to lack of funds



- Grant History
  - February 2009- President Obama Signs-American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) to provide economic stimulus
  - \$100 million dollars allotted to HUD for Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes Grants
  - LB DHHS notified of Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes Grant awards due to stimulus funding

- What is the Lead Hazard Control Grant?
  - Three Year HUD Grant designed to eliminate leadbased paint hazards in privately owned low-income housing built prior to 1978 (emphasis on pre-1940's)
  - Program goal is to reduce childhood lead poisoning by eliminating lead hazards in 264 residential units mostly in low income areas
  - Specially trained contractors will be contracted to rehabilitate lead contaminated housing units
  - The program also focuses on training for local residents to become certified in lead safe construction
  - In addition, 15 outreach/education events will be scheduled



- What is the Healthy Homes Demonstration Grant?
  - Three Year HUD Grant designed to improve the health of children with asthma, reduce asthma and allergy triggers in the home and housing-based accidental injuries
  - One program goal is to recruit 250 families with children to participate in the asthma case management and residential remediation program
  - In addition, community outreach and education is a major component of this program-20 community workshops and 40 school presentations to 4<sup>th</sup> graders in the LBUSD are planned (2800 students will be deputized as Junior Health Inspectors)





- DHHS Builds on Strengths of Previous Grants
  - Lead Hazard Control Grant
    - » Administering LHC grants since 1994-over 1,600 units rehabilitated
    - » Over \$6.1 million awarded to contractors to rehabilitate lead contaminated properties since 1994
    - » Almost \$1 million to be awarded to contractors during current grant period
    - » 4.5 FTE total city jobs created or funded
  - Healthy Homes Demonstration Grant
    - » 400 Residences enrolled in program since 2000
    - » \$105k to be awarded to contractors during current grant period
