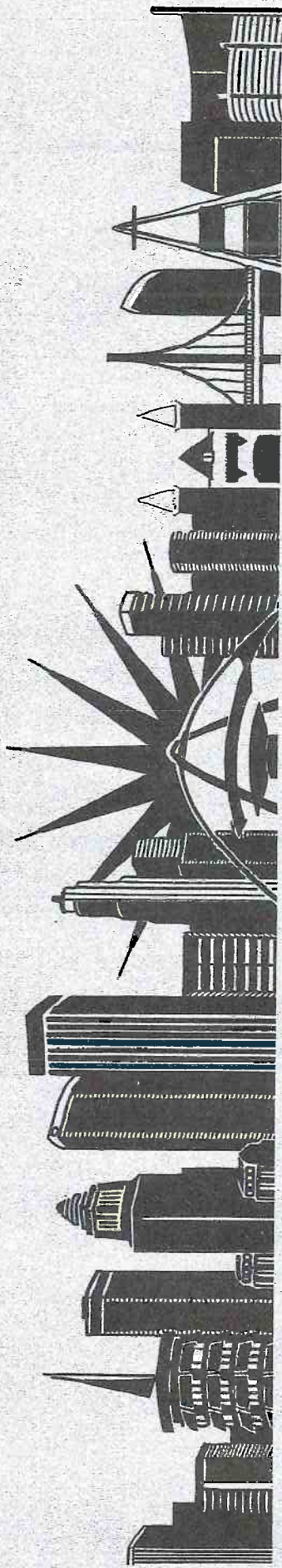
Dear Long Beach City Council,
