Potter stated that mail volume could decline by as much as 9 million items in the current fiscal year, the 10 11 largest single decline in United States history; and 12 WHEREAS, the United States Postal Service (USPS) expects to lose more 13 than 6 billion dollars in the coming year; and 14 WHEREAS, the USPS is considering suspension of mail delivery on the 15 lightest day of the week; and 16 WHEREAS, the USPS recently announced that it is undertaking a study to 17 determine whether to move some operations at the USPS facility located at 2300 18 Redondo Avenue to other facilities located outside of Long Beach; 19 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as 20 follows: 21 Section 1. That the City Council of the City of Long Beach respectfully 22 requests the United States Postal Service maintain its facility located at 2300 Redondo 23 Avenue fully operational without any reduction in services to the public. 24 Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by

the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
