


No Knock/Solicitation Registry

- Similar to “Do Not Call” and “Do Not Mail” registries
- Utilized by cities as a “crime prevention” tool
- Empowers residents to determine who can come on their property or leave materials



No Knock/Solicitation Registry

- Allows residents to register their address with City Business License to be placed on a “No Knock/No Solicitation Registry”
- Residents can post a sign or sticker in their window “Do Not Knock or Solicit”

No Knock/Solicitation Registry


- Commercial solicitors must obtain a permit from Business License
- Business License will give solicitors a list of addresses registered as “No Knock/No Solicitation”

No Knock/Solicitation Registry

- Solicitors who violate the “No Knock/No Solicitation” ordinance could be administratively cited and/or lose their permit

No Knock/Solicitation Registry

- Cities who utilize a “No Solicitation Registry” attempt to balance 1st Amendment Rights with residents’ right to not be solicited
- The City of Claremont requires commercial and non-commercial solicitors to file for a permit – but do not assess a fee to non-commercial solicitors



No Knock/Solicitation Registry

- More than 50% of the residents of Hillsborough have enrolled in their city registry
- Violators can be reported to the Police Department

No Knock/Solicitation Registry

- The City of Claremont runs their “No Solicitation Registry” program from their Police Department
- Signs and stickers are sold to residents
- Non commercial solicitors are required to obtain a permit (without charge)

No Knock/Solicitation Registry

- The City of Newport Beach administers their “No Solicitation Registry” through the Police Department
- Newport Beach does not require registration of non-commercial solicitors
- Newport Beach exclude newspapers and magazines

No Knock/Solicitation Registry

- All cities prohibit the distribution of flyers and other materials at residences posting a “No Solicitation” sign and/or on the registry
- Newport Beach imposes an administrative citation for violators with fines beginning at \$100 each
