

Dear City of Long Beach:

Communities for a Better Environment (CBE) here by appeals to the City Council from the City Planning Commission's approval of Case No. 0406-20, which consists of the certification of EIR (State Clearinghouse No. 2004081142), adoption of a Resolution with a Statement of Overriding Considerations, request to adopt a Long Range Development Plan (Master Plan) for future expansion of the Long Beach Memorial Hospital complex to include Miller Children's Hospital and Todd Cancer Institute, realignment of the Patterson Street entrance, construction of a utility trench, phased parking program, Rezoning from Regional Highway District (CHW) to Long Beach Boulevard Planned Development District (PD-29), Site Plan Review for Phase I of the Miller Children's Hospital Pediatric Inpatient Tower and construction of the Central Plan Building, and a Standards Variance for building projections on Atlantic Avenue for the Inpatient Tower and to provide off-site parking without a deed restriction. The project applicant is Long Beach Memorial Medical Center – Pat Johner, c/o ADAMS Project Management Consulting, LLC and the project is located at 2801 Atlantic Avenue.
