SUBJECT: Recommendation to approve the Conservation Corps of Long Beach
Fiscal Year 2016 Trash, Litter, Graffiti and Landscaping Service
Proposal at a cost not to exceed \$104,865.

DISCUSSION

Established in 1987, the Conservation Corps of Long Beach (CCLB) is a nonprofit charitable organization that hires at-risk youth to work on projects developed by the CCLB for local cities, county agencies, and other nonprofit agencies in the greater Long Beach area. For years, the CCLB has provided regular maintenance services for the Belmont Shore business district, including, but not limited to, litter abatement, sweeping, light landscaping and graffiti removal.

The Belmont Shore Parking and Business Improvement Area Advisory Commission (BSBPAAAC) recently approved purchase and installation of 12 new Big Belly trash compactors. One objective of adding the new Big Belly trash compactors is to improve the efficiency of trash collection performed by the CCLB staff. As a result, the CCLB management has agreed to redeploy their staff to provide additional services, including parking lot and tree maintenance.

The attached Fiscal Year 2016 CCLB proposal includes two options:

Option 1: \$99,865 (all labor and material costs)

Option 2: \$104,865 (all labor and material costs, and includes Saturday/Sunday
afternoon trash pickup, May 1 through September 30)
