As the Federal Legislation and Environmental Affairs Committee reviews the City's 2005 Federal Legislative Agenda, the following are recommended additions to the agenda:

- I. Business Growth & Workforce Development
 - G. Workforce Development

Add language to include:

In addition, support efforts to increase investment in workforce training, out-of-school and after school training, and workforce preparation for youth and summer youth employment.

➤ New section -- **Small Business**

<u>Support efforts to allocate revenues to small business incentive programs that will encourage innovation, create new, real jobs and train workers.</u>

> New section -- Arts & Tourism

Support an increase in investment in programs that assist in the development of creative and tourism related industries.

- II. Community Safety
 - B. Public Safety & Crime Prevention

Add numbered bullet --

2. Homeland Security First Responder Funding
Support efforts to enact the recommendations of the
Department of Homeland Security Task Force on State & Local
Homeland Security Funding.

III. Environmental

A. Brownfields -- Add additional language

Support efforts to establish a new Brownfields Redevelopment Action Grant investment program that can be used by cities to leverage private investment in brownfields.
