Subject:

Requested Additions to Agenda Item 22: Season of Nonviolence

I offer the following as additions to the Agenda Item's stated motions:

- 1.) Under the request for actions of the City Manager, request providing video Public Service Announcements that could be played on the City's cable access stations (Channel 8, Library, Police and Fire channels) as well as be made available to Charter Communications for possible wider disbursement with their Long Beach programming.
- 2.) Refer matter to the Human Relations Commission as well as the Commission on Youth and Children for review and possible suggestions on enhancing efforts in ongoing years.
- 3.) Invite Tim Jacob Wise, (see attached bio) to a town hall meeting during the Season of Nonviolence to engage the community in light of recent activities.
- 4.) Make every attempt to include cross cultural and multiethnic groups, organizations and individuals in a concerted community outreach and educational effort.

Tim Jacob Wise

Tim Wise is among the most prominent anti-racist writers and activists in the U.S., and has been called "One of the most brilliant, articulate and courageous critics of white privilege in the nation," by best-selling author and professor Michael Eric Dyson, of the University of Pennsylvania. Wise has spoken in 48 states, and on over 400 college campuses, including Harvard, Stanford, and the Law Schools at Yale and Columbia. Wise has provided anti-racism training to teachers nationwide, and has conducted trainings with physicians and medical industry professionals on how to combat racial inequities in health care. He has also trained corporate, government, military and law enforcement officials on methods for dismantling racism in their institutions, and has served as a consultant for plaintiff's attorneys in federal discrimination cases in New York and Washington State.

In summer, 2005, Wise served as an adjunct faculty member at the Smith College School for Social Work, in Northampton, Massachusetts, where he co-taught a Master's level class on Racism in the U.S. In September 2001, Wise served as faculty-in-residence at the Poynter Institute in St. Petersburg, Florida, where he trained journalists to eliminate racial bias in reporting. From 1999-2003, Wise was an advisor to the Fisk University Race Relations Institute, and in the early '90s was Associate Director of the Louisiana Coalition Against Racism and Nazism: the largest of the many groups organized for the purpose of defeating neo-Nazi political candidate, David Duke.

Wise is the author of White Like Me: Reflections on Race from a Privileged Son, from Soft Skull Press, and Affirmative Action: Racial Preference in Black and White, from Routledge. He has contributed essays to fifteen books, and is featured in White Men Challenging Racism: Thirty-Five Personal Stories, from Duke University Press. Wise will have two new books out in 2006: Disasters, Natural and Otherwise: Race, Class and the Destruction of New Orleans, and a collection of essays, Speaking Treason Fluently: Dissident Reflections on Race, Faith and Nation.

Wise received the 2001 British Diversity Award for best feature essay on race issues, and is a featured columnist with the ZNet Commentary program: a web service that disseminates essays by prominent progressive educators. His writings are taught at hundreds of colleges and have appeared in dozens of popular, professional and scholarly journals. Wise serves as Race and Ethnicity Editor for *LIP* magazine, and he has been a featured guest on hundreds of radio and television programs, worldwide.

Wise has a B.A. in Political Science from Tulane University, where his anti-apartheid work received global attention and the thanks of Nelson Mandela and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. He received training in methods for dismantling racism from the People's Institute for Survival and Beyond, in New Orleans. He and his wife Kristy are the proud parents of two daughters.






