We wrote you last month regarding the potential for international flights at Long Beach Airport, our award-winning airport right here in Long Beach. We truly believe that international flying represents a win-win for residents and businesses of Long Beach and is an exciting opportunity for the Airport and for Long Beach, all while protecting our city's unique noise ordinance which limits the number of flights permitted at the airport.

We'd like to provide you with an update on recent developments:

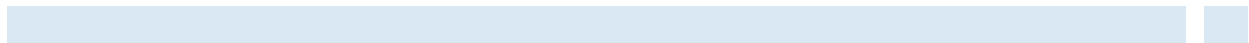
- At their meeting on Tuesday, December 6th, the Long Beach City Council voted 6-3 to authorize city staff to engage airport tenants (including JetBlue) in developing detailed information about a U.S. Customs facility.
- The Council also scheduled a **study session** for Tuesday, December 13th; as such, no vote on the Customs proposal is planned for this meeting..
- Last, and perhaps most important, the Council has set an expected date of **Tuesday, January 24th**, to have a final vote on allowing a U.S. Customs facility at Long Beach Airport. The content from the December 13th study session, as well as the airport's findings from its engagement with tenants, will be presented and voted upon by Council.

We're pleased to see progress made on this initiative and look forward to collaborating with the City of Long Beach on bringing these enhancements to Long Beach Airport, but we continue to rely on your support. For those seeking more information, the December 13th study session at 5:00 p.m. at Long Beach City Hall will be an excellent opportunity to do so.

JetBlue's commitment to Long Beach has remained strong since starting operations here over 15 years ago, and we've flourished here in large thanks to our loyal Long Beach TrueBlue members. We hope you have a happy and safe holiday season, and thank you for your support in bringing international flights to Long Beach.
