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Subject:

Review demolition permits of potentially significant historic buildings

Due to the increase of building activity throughout the City, there has been a significant increase in the number of requests for demolition of all types of properties, from commercial buildings to single-family residences. The majority of these demolition requests are located in areas outside designated historic districts. Current City practice dealing with requests for demolition outside of historic districts is to issue the permit and allow the demolition except in those cases where an application for a larger development project has been submitted and an environmental review is being undertaken. This has created situations where demolition permits have been issued to remove structures that are potentially significant historic buildings.

Staff is currently updating the City's historic preservation ordinance (Chapter 2.63, Cultural Heritage Commission) to address a permanent solution to this issue. However, in order to provide in intervening solution, this office recommends that the City Attorney prepare an interim zoning ordinance to require review of all demolition permits for structures greater than 45 years in age prior to issuance of a building permit. If the structure is found to be potentially historically significant, the Planning and Building Department would then be authorized to withhold the issuance of a demolition permit, and the necessary CEQA analysis would need to be conducted if the applicant wanted to continue with the demolition process.

Recommendation:

I respectfully request that the proposal for an interim zoning ordinance to require review of all demolition permits for structures greater than 45 years in age be referred to the Housing and Neighborhoods Committee for discussion and recommendation. March 19, 2007



Dear Vice Mayor Lowenthal,

On behalf of Long Beach Heritage, please accept this letter of support for an interim zoning ordinance to require review of all demolition permits for structures greater than 45 years of age.

As you are aware, frequently, demolition permits are issued for buildings both commercial and residential without any overview by staff as to the potential contribution the structures may have as an historical or cultural resource.

Our community has lost many valuable buildings over the last few years due in part to the lack of proper evaluation in the permitting process. In many cases, demolition of these buildings would have been prevented or mitigated per CEQA guidelines. Long Beach Heritage believes that a process of staff review can protect our remaining precious historic resources without "bottlenecking" the development and permitting process for homeowners or developers. A process that is clear and concise with discretionary staff review and assessment will allow all parties to benefit from a fair, proactive and transparent process.
