RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution of Intention to vacate May Avenue and the adjacent unnamed east/west alley north of Pacific Coast Highway, between May and Walnut Avenues, set the date of July 21, 2015 for the public hearing on the vacation, accept an easement deed for sidewalk widening along the north side of Pacific Coast Highway and the west side of Walnut Avenue, and adopt and accept Categorical Exemption 14-149. (District 6)

DISCUSSION

The Long Beach City College (LBCC) Master Plan to modernize and renovate the Pacific Coast campus located north of Pacific Coast Highway and west of Walnut Avenue, calls for the vacation of the east/west alley, north of Pacific Coast Highway and that portion of May Avenue south of the east/west alley as shown on attached Exhibit A. To achieve this objective, the LBCC District has requested the vacation of the above-stated rights-of-way. The intent of the vacation is to facilitate parking and provide for a more secured campus parking lot.

In addition, when significant new development is proposed, the public rights-of-way adjacent to the site are reviewed for sufficiency to accommodate the new development. For the modernization and renovation project, a dedication of additional sidewalk width adjacent to the site, shown on Exhibit B, is recommended. The current width north of the Pacific Coast Highway centerline is 43 feet. A dedication of 7 feet is required to achieve a 50-foot wide right-of-way north of the centerline. This action will widen the existing 5-foot wide public sidewalk along Pacific Coast Highway to 12 feet. A dedication of 6.5 feet along Walnut Avenue is suggested for improved sidewalk and parkway mobility. The developer of the subject property, the Long Beach Community College District, agreed to the condition that includes the above-described dedication.

Proceedings for the vacation are being conducted in accordance with Chapter 3, General Vacation Procedure, of the Public Streets, Highways and Service Easements Vacation Law of the California Streets and Highways Code. Findings must establish that the subject rights-of-way are unnecessary for present or prospective public use. The Public Works Department

supports this action based on the following evidence, facts, conditions and findings, establishing that the dedicated rights-of-way to be vacated are not necessary for present or prospective public use:

- May Avenue primarily serves as the entrance/exit to the campus parking lots.
- The east-west alley primarily serves as a drive aisle bisecting the two parking lots.
- Utility easements will be reserved over the street and alley in order to continue to provide for various existing utility services, which include water, sewer, power and communication lines.
- Refuse is collected by private trash collection; therefore, May Avenue will not be required for City refuse collection.
- On November 20, 2014, the Planning Commission determined that the subject vacation action is consistent with the General Plan, as required in Section 65402 of the California Government Code. The Development Services staff report is included as Exhibit C.

The Police Department and Traffic Engineering Division have reviewed the proposed right-of-way vacation and provided no objections to this action. In conformance with the California Environmental Quality Act, Categorical Exemption No. CE 14-149 was issued for this project.

This matter was reviewed by the Development Services Department, Building and Safety Bureau on June 5, 2015, by Deputy City Attorney Linda Vu on June 8, 2015 and by Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on June 4, 2015.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested for June 23, 2015, so that the Long Beach City College modernization and renovation plans can be complete for the upcoming school year.

FISCAL IMPACT

A tentative vacation processing fee of \$9,797 and a dedication processing fee of \$1,216 was deposited to the General Fund (GF) in the Public Works Department (PW). Approval of this recommendation will provide continued support to the local economy.



Find the proposed partial vacation of May Avenue north of Pacific Coast Highway and the related east-west alley in conformance with the adopted goals and policies of the City's General Plan and accept Categorical Exemption 14-149. (District 6)

DISCUSSION

Pursuant to California Government Code Section 65402, no street, parcel or alley may be vacated until such action has been submitted to, and reported upon by the Planning Commission as to its conformity with the adopted General Plan. The proposed subsurface street vacation is herein submitted for such review.

In 2003, Long Beach City College (LBCC) prepared a campus master plan to modernize, renovate and construct facility improvements to its Pacific Coast Campus. Over the past five years, LBCC has made significant progress in implementing facilities identified in the Pacific Coast Campus Master Plan. LBCC had recently purchased the parcels at the northwest corner of Pacific Coast Highway and Walnut Avenue. The applicant is requesting the vacation of an approximately 100-foot segment of May Avenue north of Pacific Coast Highway, as depicted on Exhibit A, to gain control of all the properties fronting Pacific Coast Highway within their master plan.

A finding of conformity shall be made when the proposed re-use of the property conforms to the maps and policies of the General Plan. The General Plan consists of eleven elements: Land Use, Open Space, Mobility, Noise, Scenic Routes, Conservation, Local Coastal Program, Housing, Air Quality, Public Safety, and Seismic Safety. Each element of the General Plan carries the same authority concerning land use issues. All elements of

the General Plan were considered and staff finds this vacation in conformance with all of the elements of the General Plan. A review of the relevant elements and specific General Plan consistency findings are presented below:

GENERAL PLAN CONSISTENCY FINDINGS

Land Use Element

The subject site is located within the Land Use Districts of Institutional (LUD I) and Mixed Office / Residential Strip (LUD 8M) of the Land Use Element. The Institutional Land Use District is characterized by public service uses over a long period of time. Land Use District 8M is intended to encourage a mix of freestanding office buildings with provisions for some ground floor retail, but also permits institutional and open space uses. The proposed reuse of May Avenue and any related development is consistent with these land use designations.

Mobility Element

A key goal of the Mobility Element is to establish a transportation system which can provide sufficient mobility for people and goods throughout the city while accommodating reasonable, balanced growth. The proposed street vacation will not degrade circulation. Moreover, the subject public right-of-way is not referenced in the Mobility Element and the proposed street vacation does not contradict any policies or objectives in the Mobility Element.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

In accordance with the guidelines for implementing the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Categorical Exemption 14-139 was issued (Exhibit B).



A RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO VACATE MAY AVENUE AND THE ADJACENT UNNAMED EAST/WEST ALLEY NORTH OF PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY, IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, PURSUANT TO THE PUBLIC STREET, HIGHWAYS AND SERVICE EASEMENTS LAW (DIVISION 9, PART 3, CALIFORNIA STREETS AND HIGHWAYS CODE); FIXING A TIME AND PLACE FOR HEARING ALL PERSONS INTERESTED IN OR OBJECTING TO THE PROPOSED VACATION

The City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby elects to proceed under Division 9, Part 3, Chapter 3, of the California Streets and Highways Code (Section 8320 *et seq.*), as amended, generally known and referred as the "Public Street, Highways and Service Easements Law", and hereby declares its intention to vacate May Avenue and the adjacent unnamed east/west alley north of Pacific Coast Highway, in the City of Long Beach, County of Los Angeles, State of California, described more particularly as follows:

OVER, THROUGH, UNDER, ALONG AND ACROSS THAT CERTAIN PROPERTY VACATED HEREWITH; PURSUANT TO ANY EXISTING FRANCHISES OR RENEWALS THEREOF, OR OTHERWISE, TO CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN, OPERATE, REPLACE, REMOVE, RENEW AND ENLARGE LINES OF CONDUITS, CABLES, WIRES, POLES AND OTHER CONVENIENT STRUCTURES, EQUIPMENT AND FIXTURES FOR THE OPERATION OF TELEPHONE LINES AND OTHER LINES, **AND FOR** COMMUNICATION THE TRANSPORTATION OR DISTRIBUTION OF ELECTRIC ENERGY, AND INCIDENTAL PURPOSES INCLUDING ACCESS AND THE RIGHT TO KEEP THE PROPERTY FREE FROM INFLAMMABLE MATERIALS, AND WOOD GROWTH. AND OTHERWISE PROTECT THE SAME FROM ALL HAZARDS IN, UPON AND OVER THE PART

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VACATED. ACCESS FOR MAINTENANCE OF THE ABOVE-MENTIONED FACILITIES MUST BE MAINTAINED AT ALL TIMES. NO IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED WITHIN THE EASEMENT WOULD IMPEDE THE OPERATION, MAINTENANCE OR REPAIR OF SAID FACILITIES. CONSTRUCTION OF ANY IMPROVEMENTS, INCLUDING CHANGES OF GRADE, SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE PRIOR WRITTEN APPROVAL OF ALL THE CITY DEPARTMENTS AND PUBLIC UTILITIES RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ABOVE SAID FACILITIES.

THE ABOVE DESCRIBED VACATION CONTAINS 7,198 SQ. FT., 0.165 ACRES, MORE OR LESS.

Section 2. All of the foregoing real property is shown on the map or plan thereof, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and on file in the office of the City Clerk.


