¹ The unrestricted adminfee operating reserve at 6/30/2023 is \$28,520,354. There is a net income for the current year in the amount of \$911,895, which is comprised of an increase in HCVHAP funding of \$1,135,897, administrative fee net income of \$2,663,005, EHVHUD loss of \$(3,161,433), and FSS For feitures of \$274,426. Administrative fee net income is calculated by subtracting administrative expenses from the total administrative fee searned by HUD. The new Emergency Housing Voucher program (EHV) has a deficit of (\$579,446) in admin/HAP fund balance, which will be reimbursed with additional funding. The new FSS For feitures program has accrued \$343,948 in restricted funds that can only be used to assist FSS participants. The net HCVHAP restricted fund balance at 6/30/2023 is \$1,705,250. It is HUD's policy that the Housing Authority may use the restricted HAP reserves to pay for any excess HAP expenses over and above the amount of HAP subsidy received from HUD. In addition, there is \$11,549,463 in additional HUD HAP funding that is netted with the HAP RNP the Housing Authority maintains to arrive at the amount of funds available. The total HAP HUD funds currently available for use is \$13,254,713 which is the total of the restricted fund balance and program reserve. Additional HAP funds should be requested from HUD from the program reserve when there is a deficit in the HAP restricted fund balance.
