RESOLUTION NO. RES-22-0122

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, ON BEHALF OF THE DAVID GEFFEN SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AT UCLA, DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRICS, DIVISION OF CHILD HEALTH POLICY (UCLA) WITHOUT ADVERTISING FOR BIDS TO FUND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CHILD HEALTH EXPERIENCES QUESTIONNAIRE (CHEQ) AND RELATED REPORTING IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$40,000 FOR A PERIOD OF TWELVE MONTHS

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2021, the Long Beach City Council approved the Long Beach Recovery Act (LB Recovery Act), a COVID-19 recovery program to support City programs in three main categories - Economic Recovery; Healthy and Safe Community; and Securing Our City's Future; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Heathy and Safe Community category of the LB Recovery Act, the City's Department of Health and Human Services seeks a service provider to work with the Long Beach Unified School District (LBUSD) to gather information from kindergarten parents and caregivers regarding children's early development using a Child Health Experiences Questionnaire (CHEQ) in connection with the City's Early Childhood Strategic Plan; and

WHEREAS, City has determined that it is in the City's best interests to contract with UCLA who is the only research entity that conducts the CHEQ study to work with the LBUSD to conduct the CHEQ study; and

WHEREAS, UCLA already has a Data Use Agreement with LBUSD for the

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Early Development Instrument (EDI) Project (Agreement No. 201-0295-00) to collect student information from kindergarten teachers in order to develop programs and services for students; and by contracting with UCLA to implement the CHEQ, the City will be able to build on the EDI data collected by UCLA from LBUSD to link and map data collected from the CHEQ and EDI to show the correlation between children's early childhood experiences and current developmental skills; and

WHEREAS, as a result, no useful purpose would be served by advertising for bids and to do so would constitute an idle and useless act and an unnecessary expenditure of public funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein.

Section 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract without advertising for bids with UCLA to provide professional services involving the CHEQ study in an amount not to exceed Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) for a period of twelve (12) months.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
