Advocacy Efforts

Federal Advocacy Priorities

- Direct local government funding (including revenue backfill)
 - State passthrough of CARES Act funding to local governments
- Healthcare resources (e.g., testing, PPE, contact tracing)
- Small business support (PPP, CDFIs)
- Renter/Landlord relief
