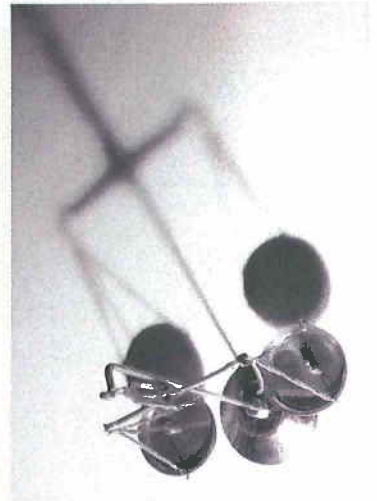

This is a California Partnership Academy, which means the pathway is grant funded. We offer courses in Law, Criminal Law, and Legal Studies. You will have direct mentoring in classes and through Law Day career day. In addition, you can learn the legal

TEEN COURT

Cabrillo High School is the only LBUSD campus with Teen Court. CAL-J students



participate as jurors in real trials with real juvenile defendants. As jurors students ask questions, gather facts and deliberate. The defendants must complete the jury decision within six months and if completed, the juvenile's record stays clean. This is a great way to teach youth the implications of choices teaching

and provides a powerful and practical tool to teach our students the legal system. Students will be mentored by real juvenile judges, including the Los Angeles Superior Court Assistant Presiding Judge, David Wesley. Students may also be trained in the newly created SHADES program in order to be advocates of change in stopping hate and delinquency.

MOCK TRIAL

The Law Acemy will teach students the rule of law as it applies to the courts and how to argue a case. Attorneys mentor students about the court process and students assume the roles of participants in a courtroom

during a case. This experience helps students learn the planning and procedural expectations in trying a case through the roles of all those who participate in a trial

SPECIALIZED COURSES

This is the only LBUSD campus with a California Partnership Academy Grant for a specialized law Academy. Students will take a Foundations of Law course, Foundations in Criminal Justice Course and a Legal Studies Course. They will have direct mentoring from legal professionals and the opportunity to apply for concurrent enrollment as well as internships during their senior year.
