



1 to Taxiway K at the Long Beach Airport in the City of Long Beach, California," attached  
2 hereto as Exhibit "A".

3 B. Contractor shall submit requests for progress payments and City will  
4 make payments in due course of payments in accordance with Section 9 of the Standard  
5 Specifications for Public Works Construction (latest edition).

6 3. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

7 A. The Contract Documents include: The Notice Inviting Bids, Plans &  
8 Specifications No. R-6713 (which may include by reference the Standard Specifications  
9 for Public Works Construction, latest edition, and any supplements thereto, collectively  
10 the "Standard Specifications"); the City of Long Beach Standard Plans; Plans and  
11 Drawings No. B-4407 for this work; the California Code of Regulations; the various  
12 Uniform Codes applicable to trades; the prevailing wage rates; Instructions to Bidders;  
13 the Bid; the bid security; the City of Long Beach Disadvantaged, Minority and Women-  
14 Owned Business Enterprise Program; this Contract and all documents attached hereto or  
15 referenced herein including but not limited to insurance; Bond for Faithful Performance;  
16 Payment Bond; Notice to Proceed; Notice of Completion; any addenda or change orders  
17 issued in accordance with the Standard Specifications; any permits required and issued  
18 for the work; approved final design drawings and documents; and the Information Sheet.  
19 These Contract Documents are incorporated herein by the above reference and form a  
20 part of this Contract.

21 B. Notwithstanding Section 2-5.2 of the Standard Specifications, if any  
22 conflict or inconsistency exists or develops among or between Contract Documents, the  
23 following priority shall govern: 1) Change Orders; 2) this Contract; 3) Permit(s) from  
24 other public agencies; 4) Plans & Specifications No. R-6713; 5) Addenda; 6) Plans and  
25 Drawings No. B-4407; 7) the City of Long Beach Standard Plans; 8) Standard  
26 Specifications; 9) other reference specifications; 10) other reference plans; 11) the bid;  
27 and 12) the Notice Inviting Bids.

28 4. TIME FOR CONTRACT. Contractor shall commence work on a date

1 to be specified in a written "Notice to Proceed" from City and shall complete all work  
2 within Three Hundred Ten (310) working days thereafter, subject to strikes, lockouts and  
3 events beyond the control of Contractor. Time is of the essence hereunder. City will  
4 suffer damage if the work is not completed within the time stated, but those damages  
5 would be difficult or impractical to determine. So, Contractor shall pay to City, as  
6 liquidated damages, the amount stated in the Contract Documents.

7           5.     ACCEPTANCE OF WORK NOT TO CONSTITUTE A WAIVER. The  
8 acceptance of any work or the payment of any money by City shall not operate as a  
9 waiver of any provision of any Contract Document, of any power reserved to City, or of  
10 any right to damages or indemnity hereunder. The waiver of any breach or any default  
11 hereunder shall not be deemed a waiver of any other or subsequent breach or default.

12           6.     WORKERS' COMPENSATION CERTIFICATION. Concurrently  
13 herewith, Contractor shall submit certification of Workers' Compensation coverage in  
14 accordance with California Labor Code Sections 1860 and 3700, a copy of which is  
15 attached hereto as Exhibit "B".

16           7.     CLAIMS FOR EXTRA WORK. No claim shall be made at any time  
17 upon City by Contractor for and on account of any extra or additional work performed or  
18 materials furnished, unless such extra or additional work or materials shall have been  
19 expressly required by the City Manager and the quantities and price thereof shall have  
20 been first agreed upon, in writing, by the parties hereto.

21           8.     CLAIMS. Contractor shall, upon completion of the work, deliver  
22 possession thereof to City ready for use and free and discharged from all claims for labor  
23 and materials in doing the work and shall assume and be responsible for, and shall  
24 protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless City from and against any and all claims,  
25 demands, causes of action, liability, loss, costs or expenses for injuries to or death of  
26 persons, or damages to property, including property of City, which arises from or is  
27 connected with the performance of the work.

28           9.     INSURANCE. Prior to commencement of work, and as a condition

1 precedent to the effectiveness of this Contract, Contractor shall provide to City evidence  
2 of all insurance required in the Contract Documents.

3 In addition, Contractor shall complete and deliver to City the form  
4 ("Information Sheet") attached as Exhibit "C" and incorporated by reference, to comply  
5 with Labor Code Section 2810.

6 10. WORK DAY. Contractor shall comply with Sections 1810 through  
7 1815 of the California Labor Code regarding hours of work. Contractor shall forfeit, as a  
8 penalty to City, the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25) for each worker employed by  
9 Contractor or any subcontractor for each calendar day such worker is required or  
10 permitted to work more than eight (8) hours unless that worker receives compensation in  
11 accordance with Section 1815.

12 11. PREVAILING WAGE RATES. Contractor is directed to the  
13 prevailing wage rates. Contractor shall forfeit, as a penalty to the City, Fifty Dollars (\$50)  
14 for each laborer, worker or mechanic employed for each calendar day, or portion thereof,  
15 that such laborer, worker or mechanic is paid less than the prevailing wage rates for any  
16 work done by Contractor, or any subcontractor, under this Contract.

17 12. COORDINATION WITH GOVERNMENTAL REGULATIONS.

18 A. If the work is terminated pursuant to an order of any Federal or State  
19 authority, Contractor shall accept as full and complete compensation under this Contract  
20 such amount of money as will equal the product of multiplying the Contract price stated  
21 herein by the percentage of work completed by Contractor as of the date of such  
22 termination, and for which Contractor has not been paid. If the work is so terminated, the  
23 City Engineer, after consultation with Contractor, shall determine the percentage of work  
24 completed and the determination of the City Engineer shall be final.

25 B. If Contractor is prevented, in any manner, from strict compliance with  
26 the Plans and Specifications due to any Federal or State law, rule or regulation, in  
27 addition to all other rights and remedies reserved to the parties City may by resolution of  
28 the City Council suspend performance hereunder until the cause of disability is removed,

1 extend the time for performance, make changes in the character of the work or materials,  
2 or terminate this Contract without liability to either party.

3 13. NOTICES.

4 A. Any notice required hereunder shall be in writing and personally  
5 delivered or deposited in the U.S. Postal Service, first class, postage prepaid, to  
6 Contractor at the address first stated herein, and to the City at 333 West Ocean  
7 Boulevard, Long Beach, California 90802, Attn: City Manager. Notice of change of  
8 address shall be given in the same manner as stated herein for other notices. Notice  
9 shall be deemed given on the date deposited in the mail or on the date personal delivery  
10 is made, whichever first occurs.

11 B. Except for stop notices and claims made under the Labor Code, City will  
12 notify Contractor when City receives any third party claims relating to this Contract in  
13 accordance with Section 9201 of the Public Contract Code.

14 14. BONDS. Contractor shall, simultaneously with the execution of this  
15 Contract, execute and deliver to City a good and sufficient corporate surety bond, in the  
16 form attached hereto and in the amount specified therein, conditioned upon the faithful  
17 performance of this Contract by Contractor, and a good and sufficient corporate surety  
18 bond, in the form attached hereto and in the amount specified therein, conditioned upon  
19 the payment of all labor and material claims incurred in connection with this Contract.

20 15. COVENANT AGAINST ASSIGNMENT. Neither this Contract nor  
21 any of the moneys that may become due Contractor hereunder may be assigned by  
22 Contractor without the written consent of City first had and obtained, nor will City  
23 recognize any subcontractor as such, and all persons engaged in the work of  
24 construction will be considered as independent contractors or agents of Contractor and  
25 will be held directly responsible to Contractor.

26 16. CERTIFIED PAYROLL RECORDS. Contractor shall keep and  
27 cause each subcontractor to keep an accurate payroll record in accordance with Division  
28 2, Part 7, Article 2 of the California Labor Code. Contractor's failure to furnish such

1 record to City in the manner provided herein for notices shall entitle City to withhold the  
2 penalty prescribed by law from progress payments due to Contractor.

3           17.    RESPONSIBILITY OF CONTRACTOR. Notwithstanding anything to  
4 the contrary in the Standard Specifications, Contractor shall have the responsibility, care  
5 and custody of the work. If any loss or damage occurs to the work that is not covered by  
6 collectible commercial insurance, excluding loss or damage caused by earthquake or  
7 flood or the negligence or willful misconduct of City, then Contractor shall immediately  
8 make the City whole for any such loss or pay for any damage. If Contractor fails or  
9 refuses to make the City whole or pay, then City may do so and the cost and expense of  
10 doing so shall be deducted from the amount due Contractor from City hereunder.

11           18.    CONTINUATION. Termination or expiration of this Contract shall not  
12 terminate the rights or liabilities of either party which rights or liabilities accrued or existed  
13 prior to termination or expiration of this Contract.

14           19.    TAXES AND TAX REPORTING.

15           A. As required by federal and state law, City is obligated to report the  
16 payment of compensation to Contractor on Form 1099-Misc. and Contractor  
17 acknowledges that Contractor is not entitled to payment under this Contract until it has  
18 provided its Employer Identification Number to City. Contractor shall be solely  
19 responsible for payment of all federal and state taxes resulting from payments under this  
20 Contract.

21           B. Contractor shall cooperate with City in all matters relating to taxation  
22 and the collection of taxes, particularly with respect to the self-accrual of use tax.  
23 Contractor shall cooperate as follows: (i) for all leases and purchases of materials,  
24 equipment, supplies, or other tangible personal property totaling over \$100,000 shipped  
25 from outside California, a qualified Contractor shall complete and submit to the  
26 appropriate governmental entity the form in Appendix "A" attached hereto; and (ii) for  
27 construction contracts and subcontracts totaling \$5,000,000 or more, Contractor shall  
28 obtain a sub-permit from the California Board of Equalization for the Work site.

1 "Qualified" means that the Contractor purchased at least \$500,000 in tangible personal  
2 property that was subject to sales or use tax in the previous calendar year.

3 C. In completing the form and obtaining the permit(s), Contractor shall use  
4 the address of the Work site as its business address and may use any address for its  
5 mailing address. Copies of the form and permit(s) shall also be delivered to the City  
6 Engineer. The form must be submitted and the permit(s) obtained as soon as Contractor  
7 receives a Notice to Proceed. Contractor shall not order any materials or equipment over  
8 \$100,000 from vendors outside California until the form is submitted and the permit(s)  
9 obtained and, if Contractor does so, it shall be a material breach of this Contract. In  
10 addition, Contractor shall make all purchases from the Long Beach sales office of its  
11 vendors if those vendors have a Long Beach office and all purchases made by  
12 Contractor under this Contract which are subject to use tax of \$500,000 or more shall be  
13 allocated to the City of Long Beach. Contractor shall require the same form and permit(s)  
14 from its subcontractors.

15 D. Contractor shall not be entitled to and by signing this Contract waives  
16 any claim or damages for delay against City if Contractor does not timely submit these  
17 forms to the appropriate governmental entity. Contractor may contact the City Controller  
18 at (562) 570-6450 for assistance with the form.

19 20. ADVERTISING. Contractor shall not use the name of City, its  
20 officials or employees in any advertising or solicitation for business, nor as a reference,  
21 without the prior approval of the City Manager, City Engineer or designee.

22 21. AUDIT. If payment of any part of the consideration for this Contract  
23 is made with federal, state or county funds and a condition to the use of those funds by  
24 City is a requirement that City render an accounting or otherwise account for said funds,  
25 then City shall have the right at all reasonable times to examine, audit, inspect, review,  
26 extract information from, and copy all books, records, accounts and other information  
27 relating to this Contract.

28 22. NO PECULIAR RISK. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the

1 work to be performed hereunder does not constitute a peculiar risk of bodily harm and  
2 that no special precautions are required to perform said work.

3 23. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY. This Contract is intended by the  
4 parties to benefit themselves only and is not in any way intended or designed to or  
5 entered for the purpose of creating any benefit or right of any kind for any person or entity  
6 that is not a party to this Contract.

7 24. SUBCONTRACTORS. Contractor agrees to and shall bind every  
8 subcontractor to the terms of this Contract; provided, however, that nothing herein shall  
9 create any obligation on the part of City to pay any subcontractor except in accordance  
10 with a court order in an action to foreclose a stop notice. Failure of Contractor to comply  
11 with this Section shall be deemed a material breach of this Contract. A list of  
12 subcontractor(s) submitted by Contractor in compliance with Public Contract Code  
13 Sections 4100 et seq. is attached hereto as Exhibit "D" and incorporated herein by this  
14 reference.

15 25. NO DUTY TO INSPECT. No language in this Contract shall create  
16 and City shall not have any duty to inspect, correct, warn of or investigate any condition  
17 arising from Contractor's work hereunder, or to insure compliance with laws, rules or  
18 regulations relating to said work. If City does inspect or investigate, the results thereof  
19 shall not be deemed compliance with or a waiver of any requirements of the Contract  
20 Documents.

21 26. GOVERNING LAW. This Contract shall be governed by and  
22 construed pursuant to the laws of the State of California (except those provisions of  
23 California law pertaining to conflicts of laws).

24 27. INTEGRATION. This Contract, including the Contract Documents  
25 identified in Section 3 hereof, constitutes the entire understanding between the parties  
26 and supersedes all other agreements, oral or written, with respect to the subject matter  
27 herein.

28 28. COSTS. If there is any legal proceeding between the parties to

1 enforce or interpret this Contract or to protect or establish any rights or remedies  
2 hereunder, the prevailing party shall be entitled to its costs, including reasonable  
3 attorney's fees.

4           29. NONDISCRIMINATION. In connection with performance of this  
5 Contract and subject to federal laws, rules and regulations, Contractor shall not  
6 discriminate in employment or in the performance of this Contract on the basis of race,  
7 religion, national origin, color, age, sex, sexual orientation, AIDS, HIV status, handicap or  
8 disability. It is the policy of the City to encourage the participation of Disadvantaged,  
9 Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises, and the City encourages Contractor  
10 to use its best efforts to carry out this policy in the award of all subcontracts.

11           30. DEFAULT. Default shall include but not be limited to Contractor's  
12 failure to perform in accordance with the Plans and Specifications, failure to comply with  
13 any Contract Document, failure to pay any penalties, fines or charges assessed against  
14 Contractor by any public agency, failure to pay any charges or fees for services  
15 performed by the City, and if Contractor has substituted any security in lieu of retention,  
16 then default shall also include City's receipt of a stop notice. If default occurs and  
17 Contractor has substituted any security in lieu of retention, then in addition to City's other  
18 legal remedies, City shall have the right to draw on the security in accordance with Public  
19 Contract Code Section 22300 and without further notice to Contractor. If default occurs  
20 and Contractor has not substituted any security in lieu of retention, then City shall have  
21 all legal remedies available to it.

## USE TAX DIRECT PAYMENT PERMIT (General Information and Filing Instructions)

Revenue and Taxation Code Section 7051.3 authorizes the State Board of Equalization to issue a "Use Tax Direct Payment Permit" to qualified applicants. This permit allows purchasers and lessees of tangible personal property (other than lessees of motor vehicles the lease of which is subject to the terms of Section 7205.1 of the Sales and Use Tax Law) to self-assess and pay use taxes directly to the Board instead of to the vendor or lessor from whom the property is purchased or leased.

Permit holders will be provided with a use tax direct payment exemption certificate which they can issue to retailers and lessors when they purchase tangible personal property subject to use tax or make qualified leases of tangible personal property. Vendors who timely take the certificate in good faith from a permit holder are relieved of the duty to collect use taxes on the sales for which the certificate was issued. Permit holders who acquire property under a certificate must self-assess and report the use taxes directly to the Board on their tax returns, and allocate the local taxes to the county, city, city and county, or redevelopment agency in which the property is first used. Permit holders who fail to properly pay any use taxes that are due on property for which a certificate was given are subject to interest and penalties assessments in addition to their tax liability.

To qualify for a use tax direct payment permit, an applicant must meet the following conditions:

(1) The applicant must agree to self-assess and pay directly to the Board any use tax which is due on property for which a use tax direct payment exemption certificate was given; and

(2) The applicant must certify to the Board either of the following:

(A) The applicant has purchased or leased for its own use tangible personal property subject to use tax which cost five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) or more in the aggregate, during the calendar year immediately preceding the application for the permit; or

(B) The applicant is a county, city, city and county, or redevelopment agency.

Persons wishing to obtain a use tax direct payment permit must be pre-qualified and either hold a California seller's permit or a consumer use tax account.

Persons other than governmental entities who currently hold either a California seller's permit or a consumer use tax account must complete the application for a use tax direct payment permit, sign the certification statement attesting that they qualify for a permit under conditions of Part (2)(A) above, and submit a "Statement of Cash Flows" or other comparable financial statements acceptable to the board for the calendar year immediately preceding the date of application which discloses total purchases of property and equipment for own use and a separate statement under company letterhead certifying that five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) or more of such purchases were subject to use tax.
