I have called Long Beach home for almost 20 years and was a small business owner for 10 of those 20 years. Long Beach has always been a diverse city that is rich in culture. I moved the bookstore that I co-owned to 4th Street from the East Village Arts District in 2007 and it was the sense of community with like-businesses and shoppers that drew me to want to relocate to Retro Row.

At that time, 4th Street did not nearly have the nightlife that it does today. The only businesses that stayed open past 6pm other than the bookstore was Portfolio and Golden Burger.
