A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH IN SUPPORT OF H.R. 302, THE FILIPINO VETERANS EQUITY ACT OF 2005

WHEREAS, in 1941, President Roosevelt called member of the Philippine Commonwealth Army into the service of the United States; and

WHEREAS, from 1941 to 1945, over 100,000 Filipinos fought alongside the allies to reclaim the Philippine Islands from Japan; and

WHEREAS, a second group of Filipino veterans enlisted in the U.S. Armed Forces after October 6, 1945; and

WHEREAS, Congress enacted the Rescission Act of 1946, which limited Filipino veterans' eligibility for service-connected disability pensions, death benefits, and other benefits provided to U.S. Armed Forces veterans; and

WHEREAS, there are less than 50,000 survivors of the total estimated 300,000 Filipino veterans who served during World War II, and approximately 20,000 of these survivors are not receiving the full benefits they earned; and

WHEREAS, House Resolution (H.R.) 302, The Filipino Veterans Equity
Act of 2005 would resolve this unfair situation by amending Title 38 of the United
States Code to deem certain service in the organized military forces of the Government
of the Commonwealth of the Philippines and the Philippine Scouts to have been active
service for purposes of benefits under programs administered by the Secretary of
Veterans Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach desires to express its support for this action to restore benefits to veterans who served this country.
