- Developed in partnership with the City Manager
- Makes large investments in critical challenges including:
 Homelessness, Public Safety and Infrastructure Improvements
- Budget is structurally balanced and responsible



PUBLIC SAFETY INVESTMENTS

FY19 Budget includes:

- Four new Quality of Life officers in Police Department
- New HEART Team of two Firefighters in Fire Department
- \$41 Million in funding to rebuild our Police and Fire academies, fund body worn cameras, and modernize communication technologies for both departments



PUBLIC SAFETY INVESTMENTS

- Engine 17 with twelve new firefighter positions
- Community Rapid Response Bike Team of six new police officer positions
- These restorations will enhance our departments' ability to respond to emergencies and to keep our communities safe



ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS

Significant new resources to address citywide impacts of statewide homelessness crisis:

- \$12.3 in one-time funds from the State proposed by the Big 10 California Mayors
- \$3.4 million in capital funding for a year-round homeless shelter
- \$2.6 million from LA County Measure H



ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS

Resources to fund new programs and initiatives including:

- Everyone Home Innovation Grants to fund community organizations and neighborhood groups to reduce street homelessness
- Clean Team to employ people experiencing homelessness to clean our communities
- Parking Meters to increase donations to prevent homelessness

- Funding for additional academies

COMMUNITY INVESTMENTS

FY 19 budget also makes new investments in our communities:

- Seven days a week of access to Long Beach libraries
- Significant investments in local arts and culture: 1% for the Arts,
 enhancements to Long Beach Museum of Art, Art Council and MOLAA
- \$200,000 Youth Fund programmed through a participatory budgeting process
- \$200,000 Fund to expunge low-level marijuana convictions
