2 Assessment, in accordance with LAHSA Agreement No. 2017CNGFH171,
3 Attachment “A” entitled “Statement of Work”, Attachment “B” entitled “Budget”,
4 Attachment “C” entitled “Certification Regarding Compliance with Americans with
5 Disabilities Act,” Attachment “D” entitled “Certification Regarding Debarment,”
6 Attachment “E” entitled “Certification Regarding Lobbying,” Attachment “F” entitled
7 “Certification of No Conflict of Interest,” and Attachment “G” entitled “Health
8 Information in Compliance with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability
9 Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and the Health Information Technology for Economic and
10 Clinical Health Act (HITECH Act) Business Associate Agreement,” all of which are
11 attached hereto and incorporated by this reference, and the Long Beach Continuum
12 of Care Program Guidelines, which have been provided to Organization and are
13 incorporated by this reference.

14 B. Organization shall be responsible for adherence to all policies,
15 procedures, rules and regulations contained in the Long Beach Continuum of Care
16 Program Guidelines, applicable OMB Circulars, this Subcontract and attachments
17 A-G, LAHSA Agreement No. 2017CNGFH171 for the funds dispersed under this
18 Subcontract, the Request for Proposal (“RFP”), and Organization’s proposal in
19 response to the RFP.

20 C. The term of this Subcontract shall be the Operational Year
21 beginning on December 1, 2018 and ending on June 30, 2019, including an
22 additional 6-month post-operational period, unless sooner terminated as provided
23 herein.

24 **Section 3.**

25 A. Total disbursements made to Organization under this Contract
26 by the City shall not exceed Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000) over
27 the term of this Subcontract. Upon execution of this Subcontract, the City shall
28 disburse funds payable hereunder in due course of payments following receipt from

1 Organization of billing statements in a form approved by the City showing
2 expenditures and costs identified in Attachment "B".

3 B. The City shall pay to Organization the amounts specified in
4 Attachment "B" for the categories, criteria and rates established in that Attachment.
5 Organization may, with the prior written approval of the Director of the City's
6 Department of Health and Human Services, or his designee, make adjustments
7 within and among the categories of expenditures in Attachment "B"; provided,
8 however, that such adjustment(s) shall not cause the amount of the total budget
9 stated in Attachment "B" to be exceeded.

10 C. Organization shall prepare monthly invoices and submit them
11 to the City within fifteen (15) days after the end of the month in which Organization
12 provided services. Organization shall attach cancelled checks and other
13 documentation supporting the charges. Failure to submit an invoice and its
14 accompanying documentation within the 15-day period may result in late payment
15 from the City. Submission of incorrect invoices or inadequate documentation shall
16 result in a Disallowed Cost Report. The Disallowed Cost Report was created to
17 provide detail to Organization for the purpose of communicating disallowed costs
18 due to reasons of insufficient source documentation, ineligible expenses, exceeded
19 line items, and similar reasons. In the event that an item is disallowed in the invoice,
20 Organization will be permitted to resubmit the disallowed costs along with adequate
21 source documentation, other eligible expenses, and the like in the next invoice. The
22 City reserves the right to refuse payment of an invoice (a) received by it thirty (30)
23 days after Organization provided the services relating to that invoice; (b) for in
24 allocable or ineligible expenses; or (c) for the unauthorized expense of funds
25 requiring written approval for budget changes or modifications.

26 D. Organization shall prepare quarterly reports and submit them
27 along with all invoice backup documentation to the City within fifteen (15) days after
28 the end of the quarter in which Organization provided services.

1 E. The City closes its fiscal year during the months of August and
2 September; Organization acknowledges and agrees that the City's payment of
3 invoices will be slightly slower during that time.

4 F. No later than thirty (30) days after the completion of the
5 Operational Year during the term of this Subcontract, Organization shall submit to
6 the City a final invoice and APR certified by one of Organization's officers or by its
7 Executive Director.

8 G. The City reserves the right to withhold payment of an invoice
9 pending satisfactory completion of an audit, as determined by the City in its sole
10 discretion, or Organization's cure of a breach of this Subcontract, as determined by
11 the City in its sole discretion, after being notified of such breach by the City.

12 H. All reimbursement by the City is contingent upon the City's
13 receipt of funds from the County of Los Angeles. The City reserves the right to
14 refuse payment of an invoice until such time as it receives funds from County of Los
15 Angeles sufficient to cover the expenses in the invoice.

16 Section 4.

17 A. Organization's records relating to the performance of this
18 Subcontract shall be kept in accordance with generally accepted accounting
19 principles and in the manner prescribed by the City. Organization's records shall be
20 current and complete. The City and County of Los Angeles, and their respective
21 representatives, shall have the right to examine, copy, inspect, extract from, and
22 audit financial and other records related, directly or indirectly, to this Subcontract
23 during Organization's normal business hours to include announced and
24 unannounced site visits during the term of the Subcontract and thereafter. If
25 examination of these financial and other records by the City and/or County of Los
26 Angeles reveals that Organization has not used these grant funds for the purposes
27 and on the conditions stated in this Subcontract, then Organization covenants,
28 agrees to and shall immediately repay all or that portion of the grant funds which

1 were improperly used. If Organization is unable to repay all or that portion of the
2 grant funds, then the City will terminate all activities of Organization under this
3 Subcontract and pursue appropriate legal action to collect the funds. Alternatively,
4 to the extent the City has been refusing payment of any invoices, the City may
5 continue to withhold such funds equal to the amount of improperly used grant funds,
6 regardless of whether the funds being withheld by the City were improperly used.

7 B. In addition, Organization shall provide any information that the
8 City Auditor and other City representatives require in order to monitor and evaluate
9 Organization's program performance hereunder. The City reserves the right to
10 review and request copies of all documentation related, directly or indirectly, to the
11 program funded by this Subcontract, including by way of example but not limited to,
12 case files, program files, policies and procedures. Organization shall provide all
13 reports, documents or information requested by the City within three (3) days after
14 receipt of a written or oral request from a City representative, unless a longer period
15 of time is otherwise expressly stated by the representative. In addition, Organization
16 shall develop and implement ongoing methods to self-evaluate its personnel and
17 obtain client feedback for continual improvement of project operations.

18 C. Organization shall comply with Homeless Management
19 Information System (HMIS) requirements and ensure full participation in the City's
20 HMIS. Organizations that provide domestic violence and legal services are
21 permitted to use a comparable database to capture required data elements that
22 comply with HMIS data and reporting requirements.

23 D. If Organization spends Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
24 (\$750,000) or more in Federal funds in an Operational Year, then Organization shall
25 submit an audit report to the City in accordance with OMB Super Circular no later
26 than thirty (30) days after receipt of the audit report from Organization's auditor or
27 no later than nine (9) months after the end of the Operational Year, whichever is
28 earlier. If Organization spends less than Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars

1 (\$750,000) in Federal grant funds in an Operational Year, submission of the audited
2 financial statement is required.

3 Section 5.

4 A. Organization will maintain the confidentiality of records
5 pertaining to any individual or family that was provided family violence prevention or
6 treatment services through the project.

7 B. The address or location of any family violence project assisted
8 with grant funds will not be made public, except with written authorization of the
9 person responsible for the operation of such project.

10 C. Organization will establish policies and practices that are
11 consistent with, and do not restrict, the exercise of rights provided by subtitle B of
12 title VII of the Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing
13 (HEARTH) Act and other laws relating to the provision of educational and related
14 services to individuals and families experiencing homelessness.

15 D. In the case of a project that provides housing or services to
16 families, Organization will designate a staff person to be responsible for ensuring
17 that children being served in the program are enrolled in school and connected to
18 appropriate services in the community, including early childhood programs such as
19 Head Start, part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, and programs
20 authorized under subtitle B of title VII of the Act.

21 E. Organization, its officers, and employees are not debarred or
22 suspended from doing business with the Federal Government.

23 F. Organization will provide information, such as data and reports,
24 as required by County of Los Angeles.

25 Section 6.

26 A. In the performance of this Subcontract, Organization shall not
27 discriminate against any employee, applicant for employment or service, or
28 subcontractor because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, sexual

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orientation, gender identity, AIDS, HIV Status, AIDS related condition, age, disability or handicap. Organization shall take affirmative action to assure that applicants are employed or served, and that employees and applicants are treated during employment or services without regard to these categories. Such action shall include but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

B. Organization shall permit access by the City or any other agency of the County, State or Federal governments to Organization's records of employment, employment advertisements, application forms and other pertinent data and records for the purpose of investigation to ascertain compliance with the fair employment practices provisions of this Subcontract.

Section 7.

A. In performing services hereunder, Organization is and shall act as an independent contractor and not as an employee, representative, or agent of the City. Organization's obligations to and authority from the City are solely as prescribed in this Subcontract. Organization expressly warrants that it will not, at any time, hold itself out or represent that Organization or any of its agents, volunteers, subscribers, members, officers or employees are in any manner officials, employees or agents of the City. Organization shall not have any authority to bind the City for any purpose.

B. Organization acknowledges and agrees that (a) the City will not withhold taxes of any kind from Organization's compensation, (b) the City will not secure workers' compensation or pay unemployment insurance to, for or on Organization's behalf, and (c) the City will not provide, and Organization and Organization's employees are not entitled to any of the usual and customary rights, benefits or privileges of City employees.

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1 Section 8.

2 A. Organization acknowledges and agrees that the provision of
3 services under this Subcontract does not require or permit access by Organization
4 or any of its officers, employees, or agents, to any patient medical records/patient
5 information. Accordingly, Organization shall instruct its officers, employees, and
6 agents that they are not to pursue, or gain access to, patient medical records/patient
7 information for any reason whatsoever.

8 B. Notwithstanding the forgoing, the parties acknowledge that in
9 the course of the provision of services hereunder, Organization or its officers,
10 employees, and agents, may have inadvertent access to patient medical
11 records/patient information. Organization understands and agrees that neither it nor
12 its officers, employees, or agents, are to take advantage of such access for any
13 purpose whatsoever.

14 C. Additionally, in the event of such inadvertent access,
15 Organization and its officers, employees, and agents, shall maintain the
16 confidentiality of any information obtained and shall notify the City that such access
17 has been gained immediately, or upon the first reasonable opportunity to do so. In
18 the event of any access, whether inadvertent or intentional, Organization shall
19 indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, and the County of Los Angeles, its
20 officers, employees, and agents, from and against any and all liability, including but
21 not limited to, actions, claims, costs, demands, expenses, and fees (including
22 attorney and expert witness fees) arising from or connected with Organization or its
23 officers', employees', or agents', access to patient medical records/patient
24 information. Organization agrees to provide appropriate training to its employees
25 regarding their obligations as described hereinabove.

26 Section 9. This Subcontract contemplates the personal services of
27 Organization and Organization's employees. Organization shall not delegate its duties or
28 assign its rights hereunder, or any interest therein or any portion thereof, without the prior

1 written consent of the City. Any attempted assignment or delegation shall be void, and any
2 assignee or delegate shall acquire no right or interest by reason of such attempted
3 assignment or delegation.

4 Section 10.

5 A. Organization shall indemnify, protect and hold harmless City,
6 its Boards, Commissions, and their officials, employees and agents ("Indemnified
7 Parties"), from and against any and all liability, claims, demands, damage, loss,
8 obligations, causes of action, proceedings, awards, fines, judgments, penalties,
9 costs and expenses, arising or alleged to have arisen, in whole or in part, out of or
10 in connection with (1) Organization's breach or failure to comply with any of its
11 obligations contained in this Subcontract, or (2) negligent or willful acts, errors,
12 omissions or misrepresentations committed by Organization, its officers,
13 employees, agents, subcontractors, or anyone under Organization's control, in the
14 performance of work or services under this Subcontract (collectively "Claims" or
15 individually "Claim").

16 B. In addition to Organization's duty to indemnify, Organization
17 shall have a separate and wholly independent duty to defend Indemnified Parties at
18 Organization's expense by legal counsel approved by City, from and against all
19 Claims, and shall continue this defense until the Claims are resolved, whether by
20 settlement, judgment or otherwise. No finding or judgment of negligence, fault,
21 breach, or the like on the part of Organization shall be required for the duty to defend
22 to arise. City shall notify Organization of any Claim, shall tender the defense of the
23 Claim to Organization, and shall assist Organization, as may be reasonably
24 requested, in the defense.

25 C. If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that a Claim was
26 caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of Indemnified Parties,
27 Organization's costs of defense and indemnity shall be (1) reimbursed in full if the
28 court determines sole negligence by the Indemnified Parties, or (2) reduced by the

1 percentage of willful misconduct attributed by the court to the Indemnified Parties.

2 D. The provisions of this Section shall survive the expiration or
3 termination of this Subcontract.

4 **Section 11.**

5 A. As a condition precedent to the effectiveness of this
6 Subcontract, Organization shall procure and maintain at Organization's expense for
7 the duration of this Subcontract from an insurance company that is admitted to write
8 insurance in the State of California or that has a rating of or equivalent to an A:VIII
9 by A.M. Best and Company the following insurance:

10 (1) Commercial general liability insurance or self-insurance
11 equivalent in coverage scope to ISO CG 00 01 10 93 naming the City of Long
12 Beach, and their officials, employees, and agents as additional insureds on
13 a form equivalent in coverage scope to ISO CG 20 26 11 85 from and against
14 claims, demands, causes of action, expenses, costs, or liability for injury to
15 or death of persons, or damage to or loss of property arising out of activities
16 performed by or on behalf of the Organization in an amount not less than One
17 Million Dollars (US \$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (US
18 \$2,000,000) in general aggregate. If the Organization may be working with
19 minors or other vulnerable groups at any time during this Subcontract, this
20 insurance shall include coverage for insureds accused of participating in a
21 physical abuse, sexual misconduct or sexual molestation.

22 (2) Workers' compensation coverage as required by the
23 Labor Code of the State of California and Employer's liability insurance with
24 minimum limits of One Million Dollars (US \$1,000,000) per accident or
25 occupational illness. The policy shall be endorsed with a waiver of the
26 insurer's right of subrogation against the City of Long Beach, and their
27 officials, employees, and agents.

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(3) Automobile liability insurance equivalent in coverage scope to ISO CA 00 01 06 92 in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (US \$500,000) combined single limit (CSL) per accident for bodily injury and property damage covering owned, non-owned, and hired automobiles.

(4) As applicable to the discipline of the Organization, professional liability or errors and omissions liability insurance in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim and in aggregate covering the services provided pursuant to this Subcontract.

B. Any self-insurance program or self-insurance retention must be approved separately in writing by City and shall protect the City of Long Beach, and their officials, employees, and agents in the same manner and to the same extent as they would have been protected had the policy or policies not contained retention provisions. Each insurance policy shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, or canceled by either party except after thirty (30) days prior written notice to City, and shall be primary and not contributing to any other insurance or self-insurance maintained by City.

C. Any subcontractors which Organization may use in the performance of this Subcontract shall be required to indemnify the City to the same extent as the Organization and to maintain insurance in compliance with the provisions of this section.

D. Organization shall deliver to City certificates of insurance and original endorsements for approval as to sufficiency and form prior to the start of performance hereunder. The certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy shall contain the original signature of a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. "Claims-made" policies are not acceptable unless City Risk Manager determines that "Occurrence" policies are not available in the market for the risk being insured. If a "Claims-made" policy is accepted, it must provide for

1 an extended reporting period of not less than one hundred eighty (180) days. Such
2 insurance as required herein shall not be deemed to limit Organization's liability
3 relating to performance under this Subcontract. City reserves the right to require
4 complete certified copies of all said policies at any time.

5 E. Any modification or waiver of the insurance requirements
6 herein shall be made only with the approval of City Risk Manager. The procuring of
7 insurance shall not be construed as a limitation on liability or as full performance of
8 the indemnification provisions of this Subcontract.

9 F. Organization shall within thirty (30) days prior to expiration of
10 this insurance, furnish to the City certificates of insurance and endorsements
11 evidencing renewal of the insurance. The City reserves the right to require complete
12 certified copies of all policies of Organization and Organization's contractors and
13 subcontractors, at any time.

14 **Section 12.**

15 A. When acquiring or leasing property pursuant to this
16 Subcontract, Organization shall comply with the requirements of all federal, state,
17 and local health and safety laws and environmental protection laws, including but
18 not limited to the Lead-Based Paint Poisoning Prevention Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 4822-
19 4846, the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 ("Title X"),
20 42 §§ U.S.C., §§ 4851-4856, the regulations at 24 C.F.R. part 35 and 15 U.S.C., §§
21 2681 ("title IV-Lead Exposure Reduction") by undertaking, or requiring the owner to
22 undertake, to remove, encapsulate, or enclose lead-based paint and lead
23 contaminated dust and soil. Contractors leasing existing sites must assure the City
24 that an inspection for the presence of lead-based paint hazards has taken place.
25 Organization are precluded from leasing structures where lead-based paint exists
26 and abatement has not taken place. Organization is further prohibited from
27 sheltering any adult or minor child in a structure where lead-based paint is known to
28 exist.

1 B. Organization certifies that, if grant funds are used for
2 renovation or conversion of the building for which the grant funds will be used, then
3 the building must be maintained as a shelter for or provide supportive services to
4 homeless individuals for not less than ten (10) years nor more than fifteen (15) years
5 according to a written determination delivered to Organization by the City, and such
6 determination shall state when the applicable period of time shall commence and
7 terminate.

8 C. Organization certifies that the building for which the grant funds
9 will be used for supportive services, assessment and/or homeless prevention
10 services shall be maintained as a shelter or provider of programs for homeless
11 individuals during the term of this Subcontract.

12 D. Organization shall comply with all requirements of the City's
13 Municipal Code relating to building code standards in undertaking any activities or
14 renovations using grant funds.

15 E. Organization shall not commence services until the City's
16 Development Services has completed an environmental review under 24 CFR Part
17 50, and Organization shall not commence such services until the City informs
18 Organization of the completion and conditions of said environmental review.

19 F. Organization shall provide reports as required by the City and
20 County of Los Angeles and as required in this Subcontract and applicable laws and
21 regulations.

22 G. In addition to, and not in substitution for, other terms of this
23 Subcontract regarding the provision of services or the payment of operating costs
24 for supportive services only or housing, and except as described in Section 12.G
25 below, Organization shall not:

26 (1) Represent that it is, or may be deemed to be, a religious
27 or denominational institution or organization or an organization operated for
28 religious purposes that is supervised or controlled by or in connection with a

1 religious or denominational institution or organization.

2 (2) In connection with costs of services hereunder, engage
3 in the following conduct:

4 (a) discriminate against any employee or applicant
5 for employment on the basis of religion;

6 (b) discriminate against any person seeking housing
7 or related supportive services only on the basis of religion and will not
8 limit such services or give preference to persons on the basis of
9 religion;

10 (c) provide religious instruction or counseling,
11 conduct religious worship or services, engage in religious
12 proselytizing, or exert other religious influence in the provision of
13 services or the use of facilities and furnishings;

14 (3) In the portion of the facility used for housing or
15 supportive services only assisted in whole or in part under this Subcontract
16 or in which services are provided that are assisted under this Subcontract,
17 contain sectarian religious symbols or decorations.

18 H. Organizations that are religious or faith-based are eligible, on
19 the same basis as any other organization, to participate in the Measure H program.
20 However, an organization shall comply with the following provisions if it is deemed
21 to be a religious or faith-based organization.

22 (1) Organization may not engage in inherently religious
23 activities, such as worship, religious instruction, or proselytization, as part of
24 the programs or services funded under this Subcontract.

25 If Organization conducts such activities, the activities must be
26 offered separately, in time or location, from the programs or services funded
27 under this Subcontract, and participation must be voluntary for the
28 beneficiaries of the Measure H funded programs or services.

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(2) A religious or faith-based organization will retain its independence from Federal, State, and local governments, and may continue to carry out its mission, including the definition, practice, and expression of its religious beliefs, provided that it does not use direct Measure H funds to support any inherently religious activities, such as worship, religious instruction, or proselytization.

A religious or faith-based organization may use space in their facilities to provide Measure H funded services, without removing religious art, icons, scriptures, or other religious symbols.

A religious or faith-based organization retains its authority over its internal governance, and it may retain religious terms in its organization's name, select its board members on a religious basis, and include religious references in its organization's mission statements and other governing documents.

(3) A religious or faith-based organization shall not, in providing program assistance, discriminate against a program beneficiary or prospective program beneficiary on the basis of religion or religious belief.

(4) Measure H funds may not be used for the acquisition, construction or rehabilitation of structures to the extent that those structures are used for inherently religious activities.

Measure H funds may be used for the acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of structures only to the extent that those structures are used for conducting eligible activities under this Section. Where a structure is used for both eligible and inherently religious activities, Measure H funds may not exceed the cost of those portions of the acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation that are attributable to eligible activities in accordance with the cost accounting requirements applicable to Measure H funds herein. Sanctuaries, chapels, or other rooms that a Measure H funded religious

1 congregation uses as its principal place of worship, however, are ineligible
2 for Measure H funded improvements. Disposition of real property after the
3 term of the grant, or any change in use of the property during the term of the
4 grant, is subject to government-wide regulations governing real property
5 dispositions.

6 I. Organization shall provide homeless individuals and/or families
7 with assistance in obtaining:

8 (1) Appropriate supportive services, including transitional
9 housing, permanent housing, physical health treatment, mental health
10 treatment, counseling, supervision and other services essential for achieving
11 independent living; and

12 (2) Other Federal, State, and local private assistance
13 available for such individuals, including mainstream resources.

14 J. Organization certifies that it will comply with all documents,
15 policies, procedures, rules, regulations and codes identified in Sections 2 and 12 of
16 this Subcontract and such other requirements as from time to time may be
17 promulgated by County of Los Angeles.

18 K. Organization shall execute a Certification Regarding
19 Debarment in the form shown on Attachment "E".

20 L. Organization shall execute a Certification Regarding Lobbying
21 in the form shown on Attachment "F".

22 Section 13. Organization certifies that it has established a Drug-Free
23 Awareness Program in compliance with Government Code Section 8355, that it has given
24 a copy of said Program to each employee who performs services hereunder, that
25 compliance with the Program is a condition of employment, and that it has published a
26 statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation,
27 possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and action will be taken for
28 violation.

1 Section 14. Solid Waste. Organization shall comply with the requirements
2 of Section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act. Under Section 6002, and accompanying
3 Environmental Protection Agency rules (40 CFR 247), Organization shall procure items
4 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with
5 maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the item
6 exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) or the value of the quantity acquired in the
7 preceding fiscal year exceeded Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000); shall procure solid waste
8 management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and shall
9 have established an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered
10 materials identified in the EPA Guidelines.

11 Section 15. The City shall facilitate the submission of all reports required by
12 the County of Los Angeles based on information submitted by Organization to the City.
13 The City shall act as the primary contact for Organization to County of Los Angeles for
14 services provided under this Subcontract. The City shall facilitate directly to County of Los
15 Angeles the submission of any information related to all financial and programmatic matters
16 in this Subcontract, including but not limited to reimbursements of grant funds, requests for
17 changes to Organization's budget, and requests for changes to Organization's application
18 for grant funds.

19 Section 16. All notices given hereunder this Subcontract shall be in writing
20 and personally delivered or deposited in the U.S. Postal Service, certified mail, return
21 receipt requested, to the City at 2525 Grand Avenue, Long Beach, California 90815 Attn:
22 Homeless Services Officer, and to Organization at the address first stated above. Notice
23 shall be deemed given on the date personal delivery is made or the date shown on the

WHEREAS, the City, a municipal corporation under the laws of the State of California, is a single legal entity which has various departments, including a Department of Health and Human Services that provides a multitude of health care and related services, and other departments that may have access to and use individually identifiable health information, such as human resources, a parks, recreation and marine department, a technology department, a fire department with ambulance services, and a police department; and

WHEREAS, in the course of providing health care, related and other services, the City obtains and may share amongst the various City departments protected health information; and

WHEREAS, Business Associate performs particular duties, functions, activities, or services for, or on behalf of the City; and

WHEREAS, Business Associate receives, has access to or creates protected health information in order to perform such duties, functions, activities or services; and

WHEREAS, the City and Business Associate intend to protect the privacy and provide for the security of protected health information in compliance with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Public Law 104-191 ("HIPAA"), the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act, Public Law 111-005 (the "HITECH Act"), and regulations promulgated thereunder by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (the "HIPAA Regulations") and other applicable laws.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms covenants, and conditions in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

 - A. Non-disclosure. Business Associate agrees to not use or disclose protected health information other than as permitted or required by the Agreement or as required by law.
 - B. Safeguards. Business Associate agrees to use appropriate safeguards to prevent use or disclosure of the protected health information. Business Associate shall comply with the policies and procedures and documentation requirements of the HIPAA Regulations.
 - C. Mitigation. Business Associate agrees to mitigate, to the extent practicable, any harmful effect that is known to Business Associate of a use or disclosure of protected health information by Business Associate in violation of the requirements of this Agreement.
 - D. Notice of Use or Disclosure, Security Incident or Breach. Business Associate agrees to notify the designated privacy official of the Covered Entity of any use or disclosure of protected health information by Business Associate not permitted by this Agreement, any security incident involving electronic protected health information, and any breach of unsecured protected health information without unreasonable delay, but in no case more than thirty (30) days following discovery of breach.
 1. Business Associate shall provide the following information in such notice to Covered Entity:
 - (a) The identification of each individual whose unsecured protected health information has been, or is reasonably believed by Business Associate to have been, accessed, acquired, or disclosed during such breach;
 - (b) A description of the nature of the breach including the types of unsecured protected health information that were involved, the date of the breach and the date of discovery;
 - (c) A description of the type of unsecured protected health information acquired, accessed, used or disclosed in the breach (e.g., full name, social security number, date of birth, etc.);
 - (d) The identity of the person who made and who received

- (if known) the unauthorized acquisition, access, use or disclosure;
- (e) A description of what the Business Associate is doing to mitigate the damages and protect against future breaches; and
 - (f) Any other details necessary for Covered Entity to assess risk of harm to individual(s), including identification of each individual whose unsecured protected health information has been breached and steps such individuals should take to protect themselves.
- 2. Covered Entity shall be responsible for providing notification to individuals whose unsecured protected health information has been disclosed, as well as the Secretary and the media, as required by the HITECH Act.
 - 3. Business Associate agrees to establish procedures to investigate the breach, mitigate losses, and protect against any future breaches, and to provide a description of these procedures and the specific findings of the investigation to Covered Entity in the time and manner reasonably requested by Covered Entity.
 - 4. The parties agree that this section satisfies any notice requirements of Business Associate to Covered Entity of the ongoing existence and occurrence of attempted but unsuccessful security incidents for which no additional notice to Covered Entity shall be required. For purposes of this Agreement, unsuccessful security incidents include activity such as pings and other broadcast attacks on Business Associate's firewall, port scans, unsuccessful log-on attempts, denials of service and any combination of the above, so long as no such incident results in unauthorized access, use or disclosure of electronic public health information.
- E. Reporting of disclosures. Business Associate agrees to report to Covered Entity any use or disclosure of the protected health information not provided for by this Agreement of which it becomes aware.
 - F. Business Associate's Agents. Business Associate agrees to ensure that any agent, including a subcontractor, to whom it provides protected health information received from, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of Covered Entity agrees to the same restrictions and conditions that apply through this Agreement to Business Associate with respect to such information.

- G. Availability of Information to City. Business Associate agrees to provide prompt access to protected health information in a designated record set to Covered Entity or, as directed by Covered Entity, to an individual upon Covered Entity's request in order to meet the requirements under 45 CFR § 164.524. If Business Associate maintains an electronic health record, Business Associate shall provide such information in electronic format to enable Covered Entity to fulfill its obligations under the HITECH Act.
- H. Amendment of Protected Health Information. Business Associate agrees to promptly make any amendment(s) to protected health information in a designated record set that the Covered Entity directs or agrees to pursuant to 45 CFR § 164.526 at the request of Covered Entity or an individual.
- I. Internal Practices. Business Associate agrees to make internal practices, books, and records, including policies and procedures and protected health information, relating to the use and disclosure of protected health information received from, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of, covered entity available to the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for purposes of the Secretary determining the Business Associate's compliance with the Privacy Rule.
- J. Reporting of Disclosures. Business Associate agrees to document such disclosures of protected health information and information related to such disclosures as would be required for the City to respond to a request by an individual for an accounting of disclosures of protected health information in accordance with the Privacy Rule, including but not limited to 45 CFR § 164.528, and the HITECH Act.
- K. Availability of Information to Covered Entity. Business Associate agrees to promptly provide to Covered Entity or an individual information collected in accordance with Section 2(j) of this Agreement, to permit Covered Entity to respond to a request by an individual for an accounting of disclosures of protected health information in accordance with the Privacy Rule, including but not limited to 45 CFR § 164.528, and the HITECH Act.

3. PERMITTED USES AND DISCLOSURES BY BUSINESS ASSOCIATE.

Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Business Associate may use or disclose protected health information to perform functions, activities, or services for, or on behalf of, Covered Entity as specified in this Agreement, provided that such use or disclosure would not violate the Privacy Rule or the HITECH Act if done by Covered Entity or the minimum necessary policies and procedures of the Covered Entity. The specific use and disclosure provisions are as follows:

- A. Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Business Associate may use protected health information for the proper management and administration of the Business Associate.
 - B. Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Business Associate may disclose protected health information for the proper management and administration of the Business Associate, provided that disclosures are required by law, or Business Associate obtains reasonable assurances from the person to whom the information is disclosed that it will remain confidential and used or further disclosed only as required by law or for the purpose for which it was disclosed to the person, and the person notifies the business associate of any instances of which it is aware in which the confidentiality of the information has been breached.
 - C. Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Business Associate may use protected health information to provide data aggregation services to covered entity as permitted by 42 CFR § 164.504(e)(2)(i)(B).
 - D. Business Associate may use protected health information to report violations of law to appropriate federal and state authorities, consistent with § 164.502(j)(1).
4. PROHIBITED USES AND DISCLOSURES BY BUSINESS ASSOCIATE.
- A. Business Associate shall not use or disclose protected health information for fundraising or marketing purposes.
 - B. Business Associate shall not disclose protected health information to a health plan for payment or health care operations purposes if the individual has requested this special restriction and has paid out of pocket in full for the health care item or service to which the protected health information solely relates.
 - C. Business Associate shall not directly or indirectly receive payment or remuneration in exchange for protected health information, except with the prior written consent of Covered Entity and as permitted by law, including HIPAA and the HITECH Act. This prohibition shall not effect payment by Covered Entity to Business Associate.
5. OBLIGATIONS OF COVERED ENTITY.
- A. Notification of Limitations in Notice of Privacy Practices. Covered Entity shall notify Business Associate of any limitation(s) in its notice of privacy practices of covered entity in accordance with 45 CFR § 164.520, to the extent that such limitation may affect Business Associate's use or disclosure of protected health information.
 - B. Notification of Change or Revocation of Permission. Covered entity shall notify Business Associate of any changes in, or revocation of,

permission by individual to use or disclose protected health information, to the extent that such changes may affect Business Associate's use or disclosure of protected health information.

- C. Notification of Restrictions. Covered Entity shall notify Business Associate of any restriction to the use or disclosure of protected health information that Covered Entity has agreed to in accordance with 45 CFR § 164.522, to the extent that such restriction may effect Business Associate's use or disclosure of protected health information.

6. **PERMISSIBLE REQUESTS BY COVERED ENTITY.** Covered Entity shall not request Business Associate to use or disclose protected health information in any manner that would not be permissible under the Privacy Rule if done by Covered Entity, except that this restriction is not intended and shall not be construed to limit Business Associate's capacity to use or disclose protected health information for the proper management and administration of the Business Associate or to provide data aggregation services to Covered Entity as provided for and expressly permitted under Section 3 (a), (b), and (c) of this Agreement.

7. **TERM AND TERMINATION.**

- A. *Term.* The term of this Agreement shall be effective upon execution, and shall terminate when all of the protected health information provided by Covered Entity to Business Associate, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of Covered Entity, is destroyed or returned to Covered Entity, or, if it is infeasible to return or destroy protected health information, protections are extended to such information, in accordance with the termination provisions in this Section.
- B. *Termination for Cause.* Upon either party's knowledge of a material breach by the other party, the party with knowledge of the other party's breach shall either:
1. Provide an opportunity for the breaching party to cure the breach or end the violation and terminate this Agreement if the breaching party does not cure the breach or end the violation within the time specified by the non-breaching party;
 2. Immediately terminate this Agreement if Business Associate has breached a material term of this Agreement and cure is not possible; or
 3. If neither termination nor cure is feasible, the violation shall be reported to the Secretary.
- C. *Effect of Termination.*

1. Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this Section, upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, Business Associate shall return or destroy all protected health information received from Covered Entity, or created or received by Business Associate on behalf of Covered Entity. This provision shall apply to protected health information that is in the possession of subcontractors or agents of Business Associate. Business Associate shall retain no copies of the protected health information.
 2. In the event that Business Associate determines that returning or destroying the protected health information is infeasible, Business Associate shall provide to Covered Entity notification of the conditions that make return or destruction infeasible and shall extend the protections of this Agreement to such protected health information and limit further uses and disclosures of such protected health information to those purposes that make the return or destruction infeasible, for so long as Business Associate maintains such protected health information.
8. ASSISTANCE IN LITIGATION OR ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS.
- Business Associate shall make itself and any subcontractors, employees, or agents assisting Business Associate in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement with the Covered Entity, available to Covered Entity, at no cost to Covered Entity to testify as witnesses or otherwise, in the event of litigation or administrative proceedings commenced against Covered Entity, its directors, officers, or employees based on a claimed violation of HIPAA, the HIPAA Regulations, the HITECH Act, or other laws relating to security or privacy, except where Business Associate or its subcontractors, employees or agents are named as an adverse party.
9. MISCELLANEOUS.
- A. *References.* A reference in this Agreement to a section in the HIPAA Regulations or the HITECH Act means the section as in effect or as amended.
 - B. *Amendment.* The parties agree to take such action as is necessary to amend this Agreement from time to time as is necessary for covered entity to comply with the requirements of the Privacy Rule, the Security Rule, HIPAA, the HITECH Act and other privacy laws governing protected health information. Amendments must be in writing and signed by the parties to the Agreement.
 - C. *Survival.* The respective rights and obligations of Business Associate under Section 6(c) of this Agreement shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

- D. *Interpretation.* Any ambiguity in this Agreement shall be resolved to permit Covered Entity to comply with the HIPAA Regulations and the HITECH Act.
10. LAW. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed pursuant to federal law and the laws of the State of California (except those provisions of California law pertaining to conflicts of laws). Business Associate shall comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of all federal, state and local governmental authorities.
11. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement, including Exhibits, constitutes the entire understanding between the parties and supersedes all other agreements, oral or written, with respect to the subject matter herein.
12. INDEMNITY.
- A. Business Associate shall indemnify, protect and hold harmless City, its Boards, Commissions, and their officials, employees and agents (“Indemnified Parties”), from and against any and all liability, claims, demands, damage, loss, obligations, causes of action, proceedings, awards, fines, judgments, penalties, costs and expenses, arising or alleged to have arisen, in whole or in part, out of or in connection with (1) Business Associate’s breach or failure to comply with any of its obligations contained in this Agreement, or (2) negligent or willful acts, errors, omissions or misrepresentations committed by Business Associate, its officers, employees, agents, subcontractors, or anyone under Business Associate’s control, in the performance of work or services under this Agreement (collectively “Claims” or individually “Claim”).
- B. In addition to Business Associate’s duty to indemnify, Business Associate shall have a separate and wholly independent duty to defend Indemnified Parties at Business Associate’s expense by legal counsel approved by City, from and against all Claims, and shall continue this defense until the Claims are resolved, whether by settlement, judgment or otherwise. No finding or judgment of negligence, fault, breach, or the like on the part of Business Associate shall be required for the duty to defend to arise. City shall notify Business Associate of any Claim, shall tender the defense of the Claim to Business Associate, and shall assist Business Associate, as may be reasonably requested, in the defense. .
13. AMBIGUITY. In the event of any conflict or ambiguity in this Agreement, such ambiguity shall be resolved in favor of a meaning that complies and is consistent with HIPAA, HIPAA Regulations, the HITECH Act and California law.
14. COSTS. If there is any legal proceeding between the parties to enforce or interpret this Agreement or to protect or establish any rights or remedies

hereunder, the prevailing party shall be entitled to its costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs, including appeals.

15. NOTICES. Any notice or approval required hereunder by either party shall be in writing and personally delivered or deposited in the U.S. Postal Service, first class, postage prepaid, addressed to Business Associate at the address first stated herein, and to the City at 333 West Ocean Boulevard, Long Beach, California 90802 Attention: Director, Health Department. Notice of change of address shall be given in the same manner as stated herein for other notices. Notice shall be deemed given on the date deposited in the mail or on the date personal delivery is made, whichever first occurs.
16. WAIVER. The acceptance of any services or the payment of any money by City shall not operate as a waiver of any provision of this Agreement, or of any right to damages or indemnity stated in this Agreement. The waiver of any breach of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of any other or subsequent breach of this Agreement.
17. CONTINUATION. Termination or expiration of this Agreement shall not affect rights or liabilities of the parties which accrued pursuant to Sections 7,12 and 14 prior to termination or expiration of this Agreement, and shall not extinguish any warranties hereunder.
18. ADVERTISING. Business Associate shall not use the name of City, its officials or employees in any advertising or solicitation for business, nor as a reference, without the prior approval of the City Manager or designee.
19. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY. This Agreement is intended by the parties to benefit themselves only and is not in any way intended or designed to or entered for the purpose of creating any benefit or right for any person or entity of any kind that is not a party to this Agreement.
