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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH PACIFIC RIM AUTOMATION, INC., WITHOUT ADVERTISING FOR BIDS, FOR ANNUAL STORM DRAIN PUMP STATION TELEMETRY, MONITORING, SYSTEM SOFTWARE UPDATES AND ELECTRICAL/CONTROL EQUIPMENT SERVICES. AND Α ONE-TIME RELOCATION EQUIPMENT AND UPGRADE OF SYSTEM SOFTWARE, FOR A TOTAL NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT OF \$692,110 OVER A FOUR-YEAR PERIOD

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Long Beach, Section 1801, permits the City Manager to enter into a contract on behalf of the City, in writing or otherwise. without advertising for bids, for services, supplies, materials, equipment or labor for actual emergency work when authorized by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City is responsible for the operation and maintenance of twenty-four (24) storm drain pump stations located throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, monitoring of pump stations is done remotely through a Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) telemetry system, which has the capability of providing system alarms and remote control of pumps; and

WHEREAS, the SCADA system must be monitored on a 24-hour basis and alarms responded to in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, system software must be updated on a regular basis, and pump control equipment and electrical system must be serviced every thirty (30) days to ensure pumps remain operable; and

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WHEREAS, on August 16, 2011, the City Council authorized the City Manager to execute an agreement with Pacific Rim Automation, Inc. ("Pacific Rim"), who was the only bidder submitting a proposal to provide storm drain system services; and

WHEREAS, Pacific Rim 1) built and installed all twenty-four (24) storm water remote terminal units and programmed them to run to City of Long Beach specifications, 2) built and installed the master programmable logic controller and programmed it to retrieve data from the remote units, and 3) built the Human Machine Interface (HMI) from inception of the SCADA project in 1992 and has intimate knowledge about Long Beach Public Works Department standards for the HIM development enhancements; and

WHEREAS, no useful purpose would be served by advertising for bids and to do so would constitute an idle and useless act and an unnecessary expenditure of public funds because Pacific Rim is the only corporation, firm or individual that could or would bid for annual drain pump station telemetry, monitoring, system software updates and electrical/control equipment services;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter a contract Section 1. with Pacific Rim Automation, Inc. without advertising for bids for annual drain pump station telemetry, monitoring, system software updates and electrical/control equipment services, and a one-time relocation of equipment and upgrade of system software, for a total not to exceed amount of Six Hundred Ninety-Two Thousand One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$692,110) over a four-year period.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
