1 **RESOLUTION NO.** 2 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE 3 4 CITY OF LONG BEACH IN SUPPORT OF NATIONAL TEEN DATING VIOLENCE AWARENESS AND PREVENTION 5 MONTH IN FEBRUARY 6 7 WHEREAS, although dating violence, domestic violence, sexual violence, 8 9 and stalking affect those of all ages, teenagers and young people are especially vulnerable; and 10 11 WHEREAS, according to the National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence survey recently conducted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC"), 12 the majority of victimization starts early in life, as most victims of rape and intimate 13 partner violence first experience such violence before age 24; and 14 WHEREAS, according to the Liz Claiborne Inc. 2009 Parent/Teen Dating Violence Poll, approximately 1 in 3 adolescent girls in the United States is a victim of physical, emotional, or verbal abuse from a dating partner, a rate that far exceeds victimization rates for other types of violence affecting young people; and 19 WHEREAS, according to the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System ("YRBSS") of the CDC, nearly 10 percent of high school students have been hit, slapped, 20 21 or physically hurt on purpose by a boyfriend or girlfriend during the past year; and 22 WHEREAS, according to the American Journal of Public Health, more than 23 1 in 4 teenagers have been in a relationship where a partner is verbally abusive; and 24 WHEREAS, according to a survey conducted by the YRBSS, almost 20 25 percent of teenage girls who were exposed to physical dating violence did not attend school on 1 or more occasions during the 30 days preceding the survey because they felt 26 27 unsafe at, or on the way to or from, school; and WHEREAS, a violent relationship in adolescence can have serious 28

1 ramifications for the victim, putting the victim at higher risk for substance abuse, eating 2 disorders, risky sexual behavior, suicide, and adult re-victimization; and WHEREAS, being physically or sexually abused makes teenage girls: 3 (1) up to 6 times more likely to become pregnant; and 4 5 (2) more than twice as likely to contract a sexually transmitted 6 disease; and WHEREAS, nearly 3 in 4 "tweens", individuals who are between the ages of 7 8 11 and 14, report that dating relationships usually begin at age 14 or younger, and 9 approximately 72 percent of students in eight or ninth grade report dating; and 10 WHEREAS, 1 in 5 tweens report having a friend who is a victim of dating 11 violence, and nearly half of tweens who are in relationships know a friend who is verbally 12 abused; and 13 WHEREAS, more than 3 times as many tweens (20 percent) as parents of tweens (6 percent) admit that parents know little or nothing about the dating relationships 14 15 of tweens; and WHEREAS, according to the Liz Claiborne Inc. 2009 Parent/Teen Violence 16 17 Poll, although 82 percent of parents are confident that they could recognize the signs that 18 their child was experiencing dating abuse, a majority of parents, or 58 percent, could not 19 correctly identify all the warning signs of dating abuse; and 20 WHEREAS, 74 percent of teenage boys and 66 percent of teenage girls 21 say they have not had a conversation with a parent about dating abuse in the past year; 22 and 23 WHEREAS, according to a National Crime Prevention Council survey, 43 24 percent of middle and high school students reported experiencing cyber-bullying during 25 the past year; and 26 WHEREAS, 1 in 4 teens in a relationship report having been called names, 27 harassed, or put down by a partner through the use of a cell phone, including through 28 texting; and 2

1	WHEREAS, 3 in 10 young people have sexted, and 61 percent of young
2	people who have sexted report being pressured to do so at least once; and
3	WHEREAS, the severity of violence among intimate partners has been
4	shown to be greater in cases where a pattern of violence was established during
5	adolescence; and
6	WHEREAS, primary prevention programs are a key part of addressing teen
7	dating violence, and successful examples of such programs include education,
8	community outreach, and social marketing campaigns that are culturally appropriate; and
9	WHEREAS, skilled assessment and intervention programs are also
10	necessary for young victims and abusers; and
11	WHEREAS, the establishment of Teen Dating Violence Awareness and
12	Prevention Month will benefit schools, communities, and families regardless of
13	socioeconomic status, race, or sex.
14	NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
15	follows:
16	Section 1. The City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby designates
17	the month of February 2016 as "Teen Dating Violence Awareness and
18	Prevention Month";
19	Section 2. The City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby supports
20	communities that are empowering teenagers to develop healthier
21	relationships throughout their lives; and
22	Section 3. The City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby calls upon
23	the people of our city, county, state, and country, including young people,
24	parents, schools, law enforcement officials, State and local officials, and
25	interested groups, to observe Teen Dating Violence Awareness and
26	Prevention Month.
