## **RECOMMENDATION:**

Declare ordinance repealing Long Beach Municipal Code Section 10.58.030 related to Pedestrian Angle of Crossing read the first time and laid over to the next regular meeting of the City Council for final reading (Citywide).

# **DISCUSSION**

Section 10.58.030 of the Long Beach Municipal Code provides that no pedestrian shall cross a roadway at any place, other than by a route at right angles to the curb, or by the shortest route to the opposite curb, except in a marked crosswalk, and except at intersections where pedestrian traffic is controlled by a scramble-system automatic signal.

California courts have ruled this type of street crossing regulation by municipalities to be unconstitutional on the grounds that pedestrian street crossing is an area of law occupied by the state.

#### ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING THE LONG BEACH MUNICIPAL CODE BY REPEALING SECTION 10.58.030 RELATING TO PEDESTRIAN ANGLE OF CROSSING

WHEREAS, Section 10.58.030 of the Long Beach Municipal Code provides that no pedestrian shall cross a roadway at any place, other than by a route at right angles to the curb, or by the shortest route to the opposite curb, except in a marked crosswalk, and except at intersections where pedestrian traffic is controlled by a scramble-system automatic signal; and

WHEREAS, California courts have ruled this type of street crossing regulation by municipalities to be unconstitutional on the grounds that pedestrian street crossing is an area of law occupied by the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. Section 10.58.030 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
