HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the attached Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a contract with Haaker Equipment Company for the purchase of one liquefied natural gas (LNG) powered Pot Hole Patch Truck, on the same terms and conditions afforded to the County of San Bernardino, in an amount not to exceed \$209,923.81 including tax, with a ten percent contingency for additional equipment if necessary and if funds are available. The City will have the option of purchasing one additional unit, at the same cost, at the discretion of the City Manager. (Citywide)

DISCUSSION

City Council approval is being requested to enter into a contract for the purchase of one Pot Hole Patch Truck with the option to purchase a second Pot Hole Patch Truck for the Department of Public Works, Street Maintenance Division.

In an effort to continue improving the condition of the city streets, there is a need for a Pot Hole Patch Truck, to deal with the current and anticipated backlog of pothole repairs citywide. This purchase is an addition to the fleet and was approved by the Fleet Review Committee on September 21, 2006.

The City Charter provides an alternative procurement method by permitting the City to purchase or otherwise obtain services, supplies, materials, equipment and labor with other governmental agencies by purchasing under their contracts on a voluntary and selective basis when authorized by a Resolution of the City Council.

The Department of Public Works, Fleet Services Bureau, investigated procurement options and learned that the County of San Bernardino had completed a competitive bid process for a Pot Hole Patch Truck and has a purchase order with Haaker Equipment Co. that meets the City's needs. This cooperative purchase agreement will facilitate the timely acquisition of the Pot Hole Patch Truck and provide cost benefits to the City.

Haaker Equipment Co. has agreed to sell one Pot Hole Patch Truck on the same terms and conditions afforded to the County of San Bernardino, in an amount not to exceed \$209,923.81 including tax, with a ten percent contingency for additional equipment. The Matrix Fleet Review Study also supports the use of cooperative purchase agreements and adherence to a long-term replacement plan.

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This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Lori A. Conway on December 21, 2006, and by Budget Management Officer David Wodynski on December 26, 2006.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on January 9, 2007, to ensure that the Pot Hole Patch Truck is placed into service in late 2007.

FISCAL IMPACT

The purchase price of the Pot Hole Patch Truck is \$209,924 including tax, and is included in the annual budget of the Fleet Services Fund (IS 386) in the Department of Public Works (PW). The City will have the option of purchasing one additional unit at the same cost, and adding expenditures up to 10 percent (or \$20,992) above the contract amount if necessary and if funds are available.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACQUIRE ONE (1) POT HOLE PATCH TRUCK WITH THE OPTION TO ACQUIRE A SECOND POT HOLE PATCH TRUCK THROUGH THE PURCHASE ORDER BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN BERNARDINO AND HAAKER EQUIPMENT COMPANY

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Long Beach, Section 1802, permits the City to purchase services, supplies, materials, equipment and labor with other government agencies by purchasing under their contracts on a voluntary and selective basis when authorized by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach desires to purchase one (1) pot hole patch truck and may desire to purchase a second pot hole patch truck; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Bernardino has a contract for the purchase of these pot hole patch trucks from Haaker Equipment Company, Purchase Order No. G1929; and

WHEREAS, City's participation in the County of San Bernardino Purchase Order will facilitate acquisition of the pot hole patch truck(s) as well as provide considerable cost benefits to the City; and

WHEREAS, if the City had to go to formal bid rather than participate in the County of San Bernardino Purchase Order considerably more funds would be required;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as

Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

The City Manager of the City of Long Beach is hereby authorized to enter an agreement with Haaker Equipment Company to purchase one (1) pot hole patch truck with the option to purchase a second pot hole patch truck of substantially the same type and kind purchased by the County of San Bernardino pursuant to the County of San Bernardino Purchase Order except as modified by mutual agreement of the City of Long Beach and Haaker Equipment Company, and the purchase by the City of Long Beach shall be on the same terms and conditions afforded to the County of San Bernardino in an amount per truck not to exceed \$209,923.81 including tax with a ten percent contingency for additional equipment.
