Dear Sir or Madam:

At its meeting of May 18, 2004, the City Council approved your application for a permit for entertainment without dancing by patrons at 3316 E. 7th Street, Long Beach, CA 90804. The entertainment activities and entertainment hours from page 7 of the Entertainment Application (attached) were approved with the following conditions:


1. The operation of the establishment shall be limited to those activities expressly indicated on the permit of the application and approved by the City Council. Any change in the operation, which exceeds the conditions of the permit, will require that a new permit application be submitted to the City Council for their review and approval.
2. Due to the proximity of residences, entertainment activities shall be restricted to no later than 12 midnight Sunday through Thursday nights and 1 am Friday and Saturday nights.
3. Unless separately applied for, reviews and approved, no adult entertainment, as defined by section 21.15.110 LBMC shall be conducted on the permitted premises.
4. The door(s) or windows shall be kept closed at all times during the operation of the business, except in cases of emergency and to permit deliveries. Said door(s) are not to solely consist of a screen or ventilated security door.
5. No sound shall be audible from the exterior of the premises in any direction.
6. The permittee agrees to reimburse the City whenever excessive police services, as determined by the Chief of Police, are required as the result of any incident or nuisance arising out of or in connection with the permittee's operations.
7. The permittee shall employ his/her own discretion in determining the level of security necessary to prevent violations of law and any other disturbances arising out of or in connection with business operations. Should permittee's operations give rise to substantial increase in complaints /calls for service, the permittee shall increase security as directed by the Chief of Police.

8. If any noise, disturbance complaints, or trash left in the parking lot and surrounding area of the business can be attributed to the operation of said business, the Police Department can determine and impose requirements for security officer presence to routinely police and handle these problems.
9. All promoters must have or obtain a City of Long Beach Business License prior to conducting entertainment activities governing this permit. The permittee shall be responsible for all entertainment activities at the location, including those by promoters.
10. The permittee must provide all promoters hired to conduct entertainment activities with a copy of the approved permit, which shall include a copy of the approved conditions of operations.
11. The permittee shall maintain full compliance with all applicable laws, and ABC laws, ordinances and stated conditions.
12. The permittee shall not hire promoters with the intent to advertise/promote or hold any entertainment activities consistent with nightclub entertainment.
13. The permittee must submit plans to Long Beach Fire Department for occupancy load/exiting.
14. The establishment shall remain in compliance with all applicable sections of the Long Beach Noise ordinance (LBMC Chapter 8.80).

Failure to comply with condition 13 by November 18, 2004, shall render the City Council approval of your permit null and void. In the event that any of the recommended conditions attached to any permit or license are in conflict, the permittee shall adhere to the strictest of the applicable conditions.

In response to your request for a recommendation regarding the above named permit application for Entertainment Without Dancing, the Police Department recommends **approval**, subject to the following twelve (12) conditions of operation:
