THIS AMENDMENT NUMBER SEVEN ("Amendment Number Seven") to Allocation Reference Number 2020CNGFH239, is made and entered into by and between the Los Angeles Homeless Service Authority ("LAHSA"), a joint powers authority of the City and County of Los Angeles, and CITY OF LONG BEACH ("Contractor"), a Municipality incorporated under the laws of the State of California, collectively "the Parties".

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein set forth and the mutual benefits to be derived therefrom, the Parties agree as follows:

<u>AMENDMENT</u>

Effective on the date of LAHSA's Executive Director's signature, the Agreement is amended.

1. **RECITALS** is hereby amended as follows:

Add the following:

"WHEREAS, on March 23, 2022, LAHSA and Contractor executed the Amendment number 6 under Allocation Reference Number 2020CNGFH239:

WHEREAS, LAHSA and Contractor now desire to amend the Agreement for the purposes of: (a) Extending the contract term to March 31, 2022; (b) modify the budget based on approved Budget modification request; and (c) making such other changes as are required in connection with all of the foregoing, as detailed elsewhere in this Amendment Number Seven;

WHEREAS, Section 72, Change and Amendment to Terms and Conditions, provides for said amendments;"

Any and all references to Exhibit B, Project Budget, in the Agreement, its Table of Contents, and/or Exhibits and any related amendments shall hereby incorporate and include Exhibit B-7, Project Budget for Fiscal Year 2020-2022. - 4. Except as herein amended, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
- 5. This Amendment Number Seven includes 3 pages, which, together with the Agreement, and all Exhibits and Attachments constitute the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

Subrecipient Advance, Distribution, Recapture and Repayment Policy

It is the policy of LAHSA to provide advances to LAHSA Subrecipients only when essential to meet the needs of providing services outlined in their contract and during an established emergency.

Advance appropriations become available for obligation upon the signing of the contract between LAHSA and the subrecipient. Subrecipients may secure advance payment for all eligible contracts, unless directed by the funder. Each funder has specific guidelines that dictate the eligible amount available to LAHSA. As the Joint power of authorny, LAHSA has the power to distribute the max eligible advance amount as deemed necessary to subrecipient as long as it is in accordance with the funder guidelines.

Advance payments to subrecipients must be limited to the minumun amounts needed and be timed to be in accordance with the actual, immediate each requirements of the subrecipients to perform the work of the approved program. This maximum eligible advanced in an accordance with subrecipients. All advances can be recoupted across the full contract term and or be repaid in full by the end of the contract term unless otherwise stated by the finiter. A refund check for any balance of advanced unexpended funds must be returned with 60 days of the contract expination.

- LAHSA subrecipients can only request within 60 days of the execution of a new or anomded LAHSA contact with the exception of County LACDA ESG funding. Will be considered upon request and on a case-by-case basis and upon LAHSA determination that this is urgently needed. Repeated advance requests may affect a grantee's risk status.
- 3.LAHSA reserves the right to suspend, deny, or firmt advance payments to high-rick subrecipients that is not in compliance with its reporting requirements.

 4 In no case will LAHSA pass-through funds be commingled with the personal fands of, or be used for personal purposes by, any officer, employee, or agent of the grantes; nor will any of these funds be deposited in personal bank accounts for disbursement by personal A in no case will LAHSA pass-through funds be commingled with the personal fands of, or be used for personal purposes by, any officer, employee, or agent of the grantes; nor will any of these funds be deposited in personal bank accounts for disbursement by personal

Re: Administration/Indirect Cost Rate Update

Thanks for your patience as we transition into the new Grants Management System. We acknowledge that the implementation of a new system in the midst of an active fiscal year is challenging, especially following the unprecedented year we just had. While we know this is not ideal, we believe that this system will provide us with the ability to manage our contracts and grants with providers more efficiently and effectively.

With the input of our providers, we have been able to clean up some inconsistencies and correct errors that have been identified. Adjustments to administrative and indirect cost rates have occurred that may impact a few of your contracts. The changes that have been enacted are intended to create better alignment between new more flexible funding sources and existing funding sources where possible. The chart below outlines the funding sources that have been impacted.
