2006, FOR THE NOMINATION AND/OR ELECTION OF
CANDIDATES FOR FIVE (5) OFFICES ON THE CITY
COUNCIL, AND FOUR (4) CITY OFFICIALS, EACH FOR A
FULL TERM OF FOUR (4) YEARS, COMMENCING WITH
THE THIRD TUESDAY OF JULY, 2006, AND ADOPTING
PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE TRANSLATIONS OF
AND THE CHARGES FOR COSTS OF CANDIDATE
STATEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Long Beach City Charter requires that the City Council shall, by resolution, order the holding of all municipal elections; and

WHEREAS, the City Charter mandates that the City's primary elections shall be held on the second Tuesday in April in even-numbered years; and

WHEREAS, City Charter Section 1910 states that unless otherwise provided in the Charter or by ordinance adopted by the City Council, all municipal elections shall be held in accordance with the provisions of California Elections Code governing municipal elections; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code Section 13307 provides that before a local election nominating period opens, the local agency for that election shall make a determination concerning the levy of the costs for candidate statements;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the laws of the State of California and pursuant to the provisions of the Charter of the City of Long Beach governing the holding of Primary Nominating Elections in the City, a Primary Nominating Election is hereby ordered, proclaimed, declared, and called to be held in the City of Long Beach between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on April 11, 2006, for the purpose of nominating candidates for and/or electing persons for five (5) offices on the City Council, namely, for the First, Third, Fifth, Seventh and Ninth Districts, respectively, and for four (4) City Officials, namely, the Mayor, City Attorney, City Auditor and City Prosecutor, each for a full term of four (4) years commencing with the third Tuesday of July, 2006; and notice is given of the holding of this election and of the time and place of holding the same.

Sec. 2. California Elections Code Section 13307 requires that a candidate's statement must be translated in Spanish at the candidate's request. Further, in accordance with the requirements of the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 (PL 94-73) all candidates' statements shall be translated into the languages thereby. Accordingly, candidates' statements for the offices of Mayor, City Attorney, City Auditor and City Prosecutor shall be translated into Spanish, Tagalog, Khmer and Vietnamese. Candidates' statements for Council District 1 shall be translated into Spanish, Tagalog and Khmer. Candidates' statements for Council Districts 7 and 9 shall be translated into Spanish, Tagalog, Khmer and Vietnamese. No translation is required by the Voting Rights Act in Council District 3 and Council District 5. Any translations into the required languages shall be available in the City Clerk's Department upon request. A candidate shall not be required to pay for the cost of translating his or her candidate's statement into any foreign language required pursuant to federal and/or state law. However, a candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in a foreign language.

Sec. 3. Pursuant to Section 13307 of the California Elections Code, a charge shall be levied against each candidate for the costs of the candidate's

statement sent to each voter. The City Clerk is directed and authorized to establish and implement the charge for the costs of printing, handling, and mailing any candidate statements as provided in Elections Code Section 13307. Any allegation of indigency or inability to pay the requisite fee in advance shall be handled by the City Clerk in accordance with the provisions of Elections Code Section 13309, and in such instances the candidate's statement shall only be published in the English language. Sec. 4. No candidate will be permitted to include any additional

materials in any sample ballot package.

Sec. 5. The City Clerk shall provide each candidate or the candidate's representative with a copy of this resolution at the time nominating papers are issued.

Sec. 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO RENDER SPECIFIED SERVICES TO THE CITY RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF A PRIMARY NOMINATING ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, APRIL 11, 2006, AND A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY ON TUESDAY, JUNE 6, 2006

WHEREAS, a Primary Nominating Election and a General Municipal Election are to be held in the City of Long Beach, California on April 11, 2006 and June 6, 2006; and

WHEREAS, in the course of conduct of these elections, it will be necessary to mail sample ballots and polling place information to the registered voters of the City, and it will facilitate such mailing if the Registrar of Voters of the County of Los Angeles will make available to the City the computer record of the names and addresses of all eligible registered voters in order that labels may be printed for attaching to self-mailer sample ballot pamphlets; and

WHEREAS, all necessary expenses in performing this service shall be paid by the City of Long Beach;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 10002 of the Elections Code of the State of California, the City Council requests the Board of Supervisors of the County to permit the Registrar of Voters to prepare and furnish to the City for use in conducting the above-mentioned elections the computer record of the

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA, CONSENTING TO REQUESTS FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE LONG BEACH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LONG BEACH COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT TO CONSOLIDATE GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER ELECTIONS WITH THE CITY OF LONG BEACH PRIMARY NOMINATING ELECTION TO BE HELD ON APRIL 11, 2006

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach has called a municipal election in the City of Long Beach to be held on April 11, 2006, for the election of certain City officers pursuant to the applicable provisions of the City Charter and the laws of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, both the Board of Education of the Long Beach Unified School District and the Board of Trustees of the Long Beach Community College District have requested the City Council of the City of Long Beach to consent to the consolidation of Governing Board Member elections with the City's Primary Nominating Election pursuant to the provisions of Section 10400 et seq., of the California Elections Code for the purpose of electing three members of the Board of Education of the Long Beach Unified School District and three members of the Board of Trustees of the Long Beach Community College District; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable (1) that these Governing Board Member elections be consolidated with the City's municipal election to be held on the same date; and (2) that within the City of Long Beach precincts, polling places and election officers for the three elections be the same; and (3) that the City Clerk canvass the returns of

the municipal election and the Governing Board Member elections; and (4) that these elections be held in all respects as if there were only one election;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 10400 et seq., of the California Elections Code, the City Council of the City of Long Beach does consent and agree to the consolidation of the Governing Board Member elections with the City's municipal election on Tuesday, the 11th day of April, 2006, for the purpose of electing three members of the Board of Education of the Long Beach Unified School District and three members of the Board of Trustees of the Long Beach Community College District.

- Sec. 2. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used.
- Sec. 3. The Board of Education of the Long Beach Unified School
 District and the Board of Trustees of the Long Beach Community College District
 recognize that additional costs will be incurred by the City because of this consolidation
 and have agreed to reimburse the City for their pro rata share of such costs.
- Sec. 4. The City Clerk of the City of Long Beach is directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Registrar of Voters of the County of Los Angeles, and the Board of Education of the County of Los Angeles.
- Sec. 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify to the vote adopting this resolution.
