From 2003—2008, I have been employed as a Technical Director and Production Assistant at Long Beach Community Television. I've also been an active member of the Long Beach Community Television Producers Association. My expertise was acquired through extensive college coursework in television production which included internships from 2001—2003. I worked closely with Ron Petke, Production Manager and Television Broadcasting Professor. The closure of our local studio located at 2935 Redondo Avenue has created a loss in my employment along with a loss in my ability to extend a great deal of contribution to our community as a whole.

In the past, I've worked as a registered nurse over a 20-year span, and many of the productions that I devoted my time to dealt with issues related to Education, Health and the Arts. I've produced several documentary-type programs that have been of interest to our community local cable viewers.
