RESOLUTION NO. C-28470

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH IN SUPPORT OF THE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL BOND ACT, PROPOSITION 61

7 WHEREAS, California Children's Hospitals treat children with the most
8 serious and deadly diseases like leukemia, cancer, heart defects, sickle cell anemia,
9 diabetes, and cystic fibrosis; and

WHEREAS, over one million times last year, children facing lifethreatening illness or injury were cared for at regional Children's Hospitals without
regard to a family's income or ability to pay. Children are referred to these pediatric
centers of excellence for treatment by other hospitals in California; and

WHEREAS, Children's Hospitals save hundreds of children's lives every
day. Many children are cured, others have their young lives extended for many years,
and all have the quality of their lives improved; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 61, the Children's Hospital Bond Act, will help
make room in these wonderful hospitals to treat the children who need care; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 61, the Children's Hospital Bond Act would
authorize \$750 million dollars to improve and expand California's Children's Hospitals
and to purchase new equipment for the treatment of the state's seriously injured and ill
children. Proposition 61 will not raise taxes. The \$750 million will be raised through
obligation bonds to be repaid from the state's General Fund; and

WHEREAS, if Proposition 61 is passed, Long Beach Miller Children's
Hospital will receive \$74 million dollars, slightly less than ten percent of the total bond.
Said sum will go a long way in helping to finance the proposed \$120 million facilities at
Miller Children's Hospital which will include the construction of a two-building pavilion
with inpatient and outpatient services, as well as renovating existing space to create a
